Pittman, executive vice president of the Texas Automobile Dealers Association, said, 'According to reports received in our office, scores of persons throughout Texas are being victimized by unscrupulous bargain promoters who have purchased automobiles in the Gulf area, after they have been totaled by insurance companies, and are reselling them in other parts of the state to purchasers who are unaware of the salt water damage."

TADA is a state-wide organization of franchised automobile dealers, with headquarters in Austin.

"We have received reports of persons who have made sprial trips to purchase quantities of these new cars," Pittman continued. 
