## Law enforcement database would curb gang activity

AUSTIN - A bill to provide
aw enforcement with a database aw enforcement with a database of information about gangs and
gang members won Senate apgang members
The measure, sponsored by Sen. Royce West, D-Dallas, and cosponsored by Sen. Robert Duncan, R-Lubbock, would track movements of gang members in order to
slow or halt the spread of gangs. Referring to the April 20 shootings at a Littleton, Colo., high school, Duncan said the legislation could give law enforcement "some additional tools to be able to hopefully avoid those types of things happening in Texas."
West said the database will, in fact, give law enforcement the tools "to stay ahead of the curve as it relates to fighting gangs in the state prison walls - or be they gangs n the street."
The measure has moved to the House for consideration. Lawmakers also are considering other proposals to curb gang activity and

bringing them together, these two events drove them apart. How could they have weathered the storms? How will my fiancee and I stay together through the difficult times in our lives? DR. DOBSON: Having served on a large medical school faculty for 14 years, I watched many families go through the kind
of hardship your relatives sufof hardship your relatives suffered. All too commonly, I saw the pressures of personal crises. Parents who produced a mentally retarded child, for example, often blamed each other for the tragedy that confronted them. Instead of assurance, they added to their sor rows by attacking each other I didn't condemn them for this human failing, but I did pity them for it A basic ingredient was lack ing in their relationship, which remained unrecognized until the their world fell off its axis. That missing component is called commitment.
I heard the late Dr. Francis Schaeffer speak to this issue some years ago.
