Following the showings of The Trouble With Angels and Paradise, Hawai ian Style, the theater will be closed for the fall and winter. | Some of my best friends disagree with me on certain matters and I have long since learned that that is no reason for not continuing to be friends. <br> Last week we carried a message rom Walter Pope in which he declared he was not in favor of a tax supported hospital for Schleicher county. <br> I want to say now that we have no quarrel with Mr. Pope. We respect his position. When he came to our office on Tuesday of last week he was courteous and respectful, and his 4 -year-old boy hit it off in an agreeable manner with our 4 -year-old granddaughter. That was enough to make us kinda like Walter Pope. <br> But he says Schleicher county can't afford the luxury of a county hospital because it has been proved that it doesn't work out in Kimble county, of which Junction is the county seat. <br> We contend that Kimble county can not be compared to Schleicher county. Kimble county has no oil fields. The tax burden there falls on the land owner. They have a tax valuation of 7 million compared to 17 million in Schleicher. There the tax burden falls on the land companies pay $70 \%$ of the taxes and land owners pay the other $30 \%$. <br> This difference is reflected in our county wide school system where Schleicher can afford a new a new football stadium without undue burden on the small tax payer, Junction is still staging their football games on a race track. <br> First class facilities, either present or in building, were responsible for our school in securing the services of a top-ranking coach and a band leader, when vacancies occurred there this year. <br> By the same token if we expect to secure the services of first-class doctors we must provide first class facilities-which would be a firstclass hospital. <br> While pointing to Junction as a hospital failure, perhaps we should look around and see if all the others are failures. Menard is considering additions to its facilities Robert Lee seems to be doing well, and McCamey is going ahead -not backward. <br> Many small new businesses have failed because they did not have resources back of them to tide them over the first few years when they were getting started. <br> Don't get us wrong-setting up a hospital doesn't guarantee that there will never be any more problems. There will be disagreements and problems and mistakes. |
