## County Goes Wet

After being a "dry" county for approximately 65 years, Schleicher County voters Saturday went to the ages by a narrow margin of 358 to 350 .

Quiet but intensive work by both advocates and opponents of legal sale brought out the respectable total of 708 votes, but this was about 75 votes less than wer cast in the hospital election in May. The following tab ulation shows that only three boxes carried for legal sales, but they were enough to offset the narrow losse in the others.
