v. Santa Fe Independent School District, on March 29.
"I believe allowing the state of strengthen and add to those presented by the Santa Fe ISD," said Attorney General Cornyn, who will represent the school district.
"Asking the government to supervise religious speech is clearly Texas' position in this case," he added.
The school district's policy alows the student body to choose dent message during pregame cerdent message during pregame cergames. That message may or may not include a prayer in the discreion of the student.
In February 1999, the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals in
New Orleans held that the school New Orleans held that the school district's policy violated the estabishment clause of the First Amendment.
