## State okays Ports-to-Plains Trade Corridor route

The Ports-to-Plains Trade Cor- the project has not been secured, ridor won final designation from the Texas Transportation Commission last Thursday. The route, extending north and west from Laredo connects to two other major U.S. ports-of-entry at Eagle Pass and Del Rio, before turning north along U.S. Highway 277. The route passes directly through Eldorado and Schleicher County on its way to San Angelo, Lubbock, Amarillo and eventually to Den-

Elected officials up and down the corridor heralded the news. "That's great news," said Schleicher County Judge Johnny Grif state finally got it right." state finally got it right.
In Mexico, the vote was welcomed by federal and state officials who see development of the corridor as essential to economic growth along the border. The Zocalo Acuna, the daily newspaper in Ciudad Acuna, greeted the news with a huge headline that simply said, "iSi!"

"Trade is the driving force behind this," said Eldorado Mayor John Nikolauk. "For too long West Texas has been isolated while the major trade route ran north from Laredo to Austin and Dallas. This
new route will move some of that traffic in our direction."

That sentiment is what prompted a number of West Texas cities and counties to sign on as partners in the Ports-to-Plains Coalition everal years ago. Major funding nd leadership for the group came
coalition set out to convince the Texas Transportation Commission that West Texas deserved a larger slice of the trade pie. sticker for a 1980 model Dodge. Border crossings at Laredo were already backed up and, at times, Interstate 35 between Laredo and Dallas looked more like a parking lot than a major interstate highway, as 18 -wheelers clogged the north-south artery. Then, along came NAFTA, the North American Free Trade Agreement, and traffic along the $\mathrm{I}-35$ corridor grew exponentially. That's when the Ports-to-Plains Coalition decided the time was right to ratchet up the lobbying pressure
For a time, the effort seemed more like a feud than a serious lobbying effort as West Texas cities and counties competed with one another for inclusion on the route Neither was the effort harmonious on the local level as people up and down the corridor debated the impact a major trade route would have on their hometowns. The oo and was quickly replaced with the less threatening phrase "relief route." Meanwhile, others contemplated the strain that increased law enforcement and emergency services personnel would place on local budgets.
After a feasibility study last yeartes, Eldorado's and Schleicher County's hopes continued to rise.

## Murder suspect Gomez delivered to Mexican authorities on International Bridge at Del Rio

 ff D, Schleicher County SherBrooks Long and Texas Ranger rol Anti-Smuggling Unit agen Mario Ramirez and Art Martinez, met Mexican Police Commandant uan Garibaldi and several Mexican police officers last Friday, at the center of the International Bridge between Del Rio and Ciudad Acuna. There, the men handed over Juan Manuel Alvarado Gomez, 37, to the Mexican auhorities, Gomez faces murder horities. Gomez faces murder charges in Mexico in connectionwith the shooting death of Jesus with the shooting death of
Medrano of Ciudad Acuna.
Medrano died in Acuna on August 20, 2000 after being shot three imes. He had attended his brothr's wedding and, as the family as leaving the ceremony, Gomez allegedly appeared and shot Medrano in front of terrified family members.

After hiding out in Mexico for period of time, Gomez reportedy fled to Texas and made his way o Irving, where he managed to avoid capture for several months. But, that changed last Friday when U.S. Border Patrol Anti-Smugmation developed by the Schleichmation developed by the Schleichand Texas Ranger Brooks Long, and Texas Ranger Brooks Long,
apprehended Gomez in a predawn raid.

As Texas Attorney General John Cornyn brought charges this week against phone companies inlating to phone scams against Hislating to phone scams against Hispanic telephone customers, word came this week of a new scam targeting churches. And, the scam has already claimed victims in at leas three churches in Eldorado.
As part of the scam, a male call
er places a collect call to a church When an unsuspecting pastor or church secretary answers the call and agrees to accept the charges, the caller pretends to be someone who either recently attended or recently visited the church.
The caller then begins crying and says that he is in Florida, where a member of his family has been killed in an automobile accident. The caller's purpose, howev-
call going as long as possible. Sheriff David Doran advised hat the phone scam is very sim ar to the one targeted at Hispanic itizens a few months ago. "When the phone bills come in he churches will find that the calls were placed through an obscure phone company with extremely high rates," Doran said.
The sheriff advised anyone who has experienced such a call contact his office at 853-2737. Attorney General John Cornyn also has a hotline for reporting such calls. Consumers should call 1-800-252-8011 to report the problems, and particularly if they have received a bill from companies named ZPDI and/or Southwest Intelecom. to come. As they departed I invited the pair to stop by the newspaper office if they ever make it back to Eldorado. Jim Neff just smiled, pointed to the sky and said, "I do hope to see this place again, but from up there."
