Unique Roses Found In Rosedown Garden
St. Francisville, La.-Late bloom-
ng azaleas are at their peak in ing azaleas are at their peak in
the gardens of Rosedown, including
the famous "Felician the famous "Feliciana Reds", great
plantations of Judge Solomon and plantations of Judge Solomon and
Ping Pearl. These dainty blossoms dominate garden vistas every spring
after the delicate, ephimeral Rosedown pinks have had their show.
Growing aolngside azaleas are Banksia roses, which bloom about six weeks in the spring. These
dainty, pert blossoms which flower dainty, pert blossoms which flower
in clusters on long, thornless limbs
look like double doll blossoms. Book like double or lutea, and
Bithas flourish at Rosedown $\mathrm{w}^{2}$ te Banksia smell like vio These favorites of the South came
o us from China, and are known 1700. Many thrive so well in Southern climates, that they climb up to 50 feet. Both of these long lived and are called Lady Banks roses. The gardens of Rosedown are
rich with old, rare roses. Many scarce antie rose bushes grow in an old rose garden near the planta
tion office. A few varieties bloom onlv in the spring, among them
Madame Hardy, a white Damask Madame Hardy, a white Damask
rose dating from 1832 which is said
by many rosarians to be the most by many rosarians to be the most
beautiful white rose ever created. The blooms are many-petalled,
flat, with the petals arranged in an intricate design. The sepals
flare, and each blossom is centered
with a jade green carnel with a jade green carpel.
other old roses in bloom include
Madame Cochet, a high pointed old tea rose; Devoniensis, a large flat white rose which is perfect in
shape; and Souvenir de la Malamaison, a milk white
rose with a pink heart. The tered roses, which are as much a part of
Southern heritage as old silver and
lustre ware, flourish at Rosedown and are part of a collection of old
rosses on the ground. Still in bloom are and shrubs of spring, including dogwood, fragrant yellow jasmine, onymous with old Southern gar-
dens. During the difficult years after the Civil War, wisteria vines
were used as plow lines and as were used as plow lines and as a
substitute for rope. At Rosodown in the spring lavendar wisteria can
be seen high in the tons of giant trees, all of which have grown to
enormous proportions in the last century.
