## Calk Re-Elected Mayor For Another Two - Year Term

Thursday, April 8, 1971 402 votes were cast, incumbent Mayor Eldon Calk retain. ed his seat with 229 votes to defeat his opponent R. V. Sheppard who received 169.
A rush of voters in the last iwo hours of balloting, prevented the election crew from counting ballots until after 7:00 p. m., voting deadline and this delayed the final results being published until 9:00 p. m. Large crowds waited for two hours on the streets for the final results.

In the city aldermans race there were three candidates for two places on the board. Granvil Hext, an incumbent, received 275 votes, and Alvin Farris, a formei alderman, drew 286-giving these two a 2 -year term. Trailing was John Edward Meador who received a respectable vote of 206, which makes him a prime candidate
for a place on this board one year hence.
