PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Instruction Note: Place an X in the square beside the statement indicating the way you wish to vote.

- 1 For Against: The constitutional amendment to provide annual salaries of \$8,400 for members of the Senate and House of Representatives.
2 For Against: The constitutional amendment abolishing the Lamar County Hospital District.
3 For Against: The constitutional amendment to require the commissioners court in all counties of the state to compensate all justices of the peace on a salary basis.
4 For Against: The constitutional amendment providing for a constitutional revision commission which precedes the convening of the members of the 63rd Legislature as a constitutional convention in January, 1974, for the purpose of submitting to the voters a new constitution or revisions of the existing state constitution.
5 For Against: The constitutional amendment allowing certain tax exemptions to disabled veterans, their surviving spouses and surviving minor children, and the surviving spouses and surviving minor children of members of the armed forces who lose their life while on active duty.
6 For Against: The constitutional amendment providing that the various political subdivisions of the State may exempt not less than Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) of the value of residence homesteads of all persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older from ad valorem taxes under certain conditions.
7 For Against: The constitutional amendment to provide that equality under the law shall not be denied or abridged because of sex, race, color, creed or national origin.
8 For Against: The constitutional amendment to provide a four-year term of office for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Comptroller of Public Accounts, Treasurer, Commissioner of the General Land Office, Secretary of State, and certain statutory State officers.
9 For Against: The constitutional amendment to provide that directors of soil and water conservation districts are not disqualified from holding or being compensated for more than one office.
10 For Against: The constitutional amendment revising provisions on the time and method of proposing amendments to the state constitution and the time and method of publishing notice of proposed amendments.
11 For Against: The constitutional amendment to provide a salary of \$22,500 for the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
12 For Against: The constitutional amendment permitting State employees, who are not State officers, to serve as members of the governing bodies of school districts, cities, towns, or other local governmental districts, without forfeiting their State salary, and specifying exceptions to the constitutional prohibition against payment of State funds for compensation to any person who holds more than one civil office of emolument.
13 For Against: The constitutional amendment to set a six percent (6%) weighted average annual interest rate for bonds issued pursuant to constitutional authority presently having a specified interest ceiling.
14 For Against: The constitutional amendment to allow a county to reduce its county permanent school fund and distribute the money to independent and common school districts on a per scholastic basis.

County Extension Agent's Column

Fall Cheese Ideas
 Americans are rediscovering cheese for meals and snacks. Even dieters have found that Cottage, Ricotta and Neufchatel cheese offer them a variety.
 Offered are some tips in cheese use and preparation. As an added bonus to versatility, cheese is nutritious. It provides a lot of food value in a small package—including protein, riboflavin and calcium.
 As for cooking with cheese, the consumer should remember two factors essential for good results—brief heating and low cooking temperatures. High temperatures and cooking too long make cheese tough and stringy and cause the fat to separate. In addition, some of the flavor is lost in the process. Cheese blends more readily with other ingredients and melts more quickly if it is shredded or

diced first. As a rule of thumb, one-half pound of cheese will yield two cups when shredded.
 Soft well-aged Cheddar melts and blends with other ingredients more readily than less-ripened cheese—and less of it is needed because it has a more pronounced flavor. Processed cheese also will melt and blend readily, although it will have a much milder flavor. Due to its versatility, cheese can be prepared a number of ways and in various dishes. It can be used just the way it comes from the package; it broils; it blends into sauces; and it goes in main dishes where it's melted or baked. Melt cheese in the top of a double boiler over simmering water, or add to a hot mixture.
 In making cheese sauce, wait until the white sauce is completely cooked before adding the shredded cheese. After adding it, heat the sauce only long enough to melt the cheese. For cheese omelet, add shredded cheese after the omelet is cooked—just before folding.
 Cheese can be melted under the broiler as well—open face cheese

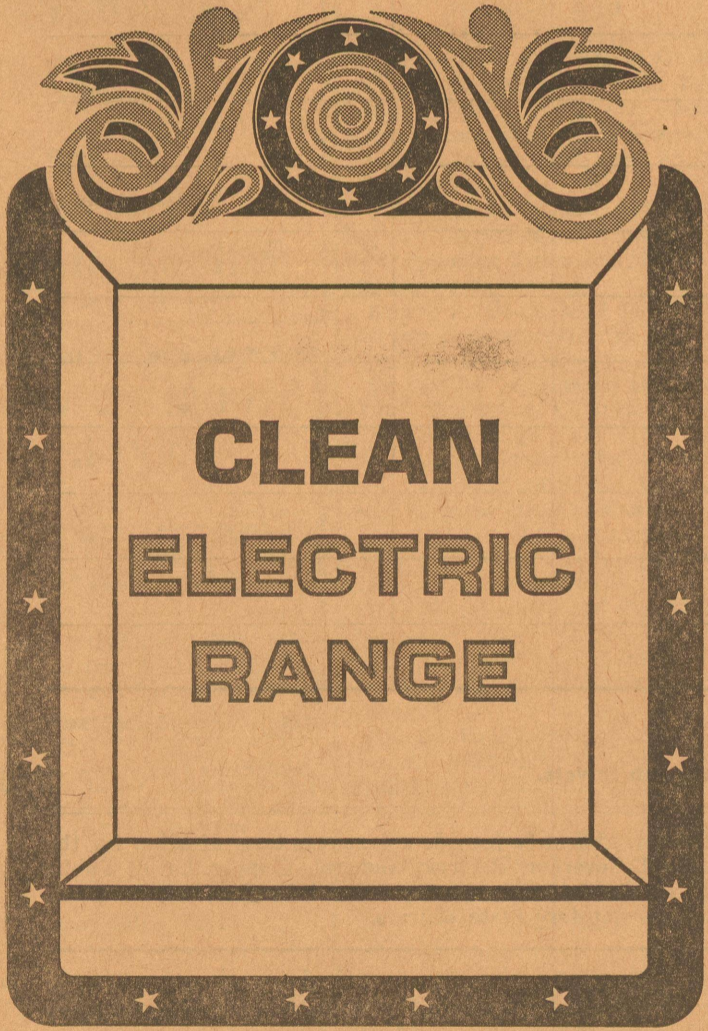
sandwiches can be prepared this way. For this treat, place cheese topped sandwich four or five inches from the heat, then broil just until the cheese begins to melt. When using cheese in casserole dishes, cook the food at low to moderate temperatures. Covering cheese toppings with crumbs is one way to prevent the cheese from toughening or hardening. Another way to avoid this is simply adding the cheese a few minutes before removing the dish from the oven.
Measuring Knits
 Simply using a small ruler can help the shopper determine several important characteristics about a knit fabric. Stability and shrinkage are factors to consider in coordinating knit fabrics and patterns.
 The knit's stability is important. Moderately stretch and very stretchy knits require more care in construction, including scrupulous stay-stitching where the sewer does not want the seams to stretch. Stability can be determined by gripping the knit fabric and ruler in

your left hand, four inches from the raw edge. Next, stretch the fabric toward the right and measure how much it stretches. If stretch is no more than half an inch, the fabric is stable.

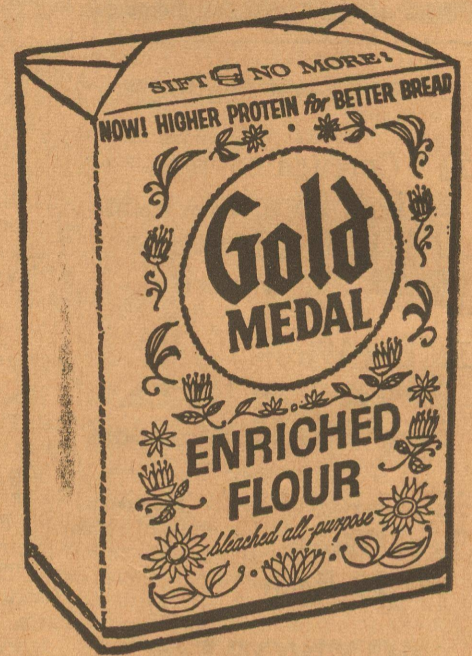

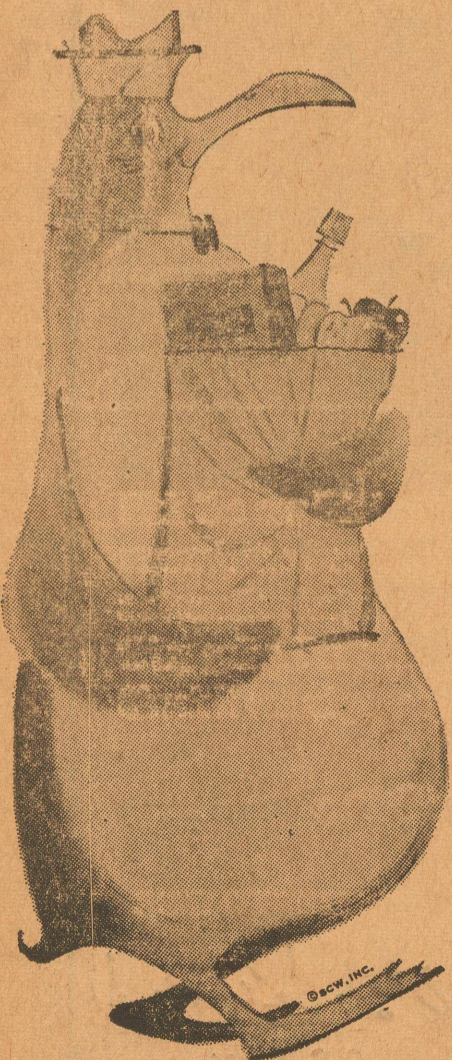
