CLAUD LOHMANN PLAYS GOOD BALL WINS HONORS AT SAN FRANCISCO

Below is a clipping sent us from California in which Claud Lohmann, an Eldorado Boy plays another good game of ball. Claud has just gotten back from the Philippines where he has been stationed for some time in the U. S. Army.

"Soldier" Lohman showed yesterday that his victory over Stockton on Wednesday was not a fluke, and he put another win to his credit by getting away with the long end of a 3 to 2 score. The military man was lucky at that as Tracy Hoag pitched a fine game of ball for eight innings and then did a wilbur wright in the ninth. Oakland landed on Tracy for four hits in the final inning and turned a 2 to 1 short end into win.

ELDORADO IN CENTER OF PRODUCTIVE COUNTRY.

Eldorado, Schleicher county's capital, entertained the excursionists for a half day, Friday afternoon, and her hospitality was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone. Eldorado's population is seven hundred. The most costly and the most attractive improvement that is being made is the new school house which is being built at a cost of \$17,000. The walls are about nine feet high and the contractors hope to have it completed by Christmas. Eldorado has three churches, three groceries, one hardware establishment, two banks, one general merchandise store, one grain and feed store, two drug stores, three doctors, one hotel and court house and jail.

Surrounded by Farms.

Eldorado lies in the center of a rich agricultural section, thirty miles square, and she gets practically all of the trade in that scope of country. The town has been in existence since 1901 when Schleicher county was organized.

Big ranches are rapidly becoming things of the past in Schleicher county, and in their stead large farms are being opened up. Lots of feed stuff was made this year

and cotton was by no means a failure.

Property in Eldorado is looking up fast and business lots sell as high as \$1,200 and \$1,500.

Robert Bailey is president of the Eldorado State Bank, and M. B. McKnight is president of the National Bank. Both institutions are doing a splendid business. San Angelo Standard.

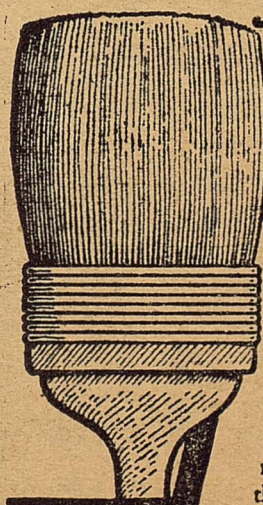
