A committee was then appointed to write Mr. Lanin at once and submit a proposition to him for the citizens of this town, A proposition was made the meeting by J. W. Riley, of San Angelo. Mr. Riley wanted to bond all the land for 15 miles on teach side of the proposed route for a suffience amount to build and equipt the road, and let the people own and controle the road.
