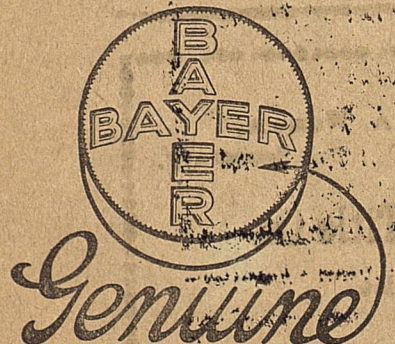

Below is a list of stock and farm products and the amount of prizes offered.

For the best pen of grade sheep \$5.00 first prize, \$3.00 2nd and \$2.00 3rd.

For best pen of registered sheep \$5, \$3, and \$2.00.

For best pen of goats, \$5, \$3, and \$2.

For best blooded bull or heifer, over one and two years of age, \$5, \$3, and \$2.

For best calf under one year old \$5, 1st \$3, 2nd and \$2 3rd.

For best boar or gilt under one year old \$5 1st, \$3 2nd and \$2 3rd.

Best coop of chickens, any good grade, \$3 1st, \$2 2nd \$1 3rd.

For best coop of Turkeys any breed \$3, \$2, and \$1.

For best three acres of cotton \$10 first, \$5, second, \$2.50 third.

For best acre of wheat, oats, Maize, Fettireta, Kaffir corn, or corn \$5 00, \$3 00 and \$2 00.

Other prizes will be offered later, especially on fruits and smaller truck growing, also fancy work for the girls, but these are left out for the present or until the committee can confer with the Woman's Club along this line.
