ORIENT PLANNING TO BUILD DEL RIO ROAD.

From San Angelo Standard.

Financial arrangements for the immediate commencement and the prompt completion of the Orient extension to Del Rio, at least as far as Sonora, will be perfected by September 1.

A. J. Cleary, trainmaster here for the Texas Orient, succeeds the late N. J. O'Brien of San Angelo as acting superintendent.

A statement dictated by Judge James Cornell of Sonora and Clifford Histed of Kansas City and issued to the press reads as follows: "The present status of the Del Rio branch of the Orient was gone into carefully and the members of the citizens' committees were satisfied, from statements made by officials of the Orient, that all possible is being done to assure the early commencement and prompt completion of the Del Rio extension, at least as far as Sonora, and the committees were likewise satisfied that since the settlement of the railroad controversy by the passage of the Esch-Cummings bill, commonly known as the "Transportation act" that within a very short time and before September 1, 1920, financial arrangements will be completed to enable the immediate commencement and prompt completion of the work.

"Under the arrangement suggested, all the money necessary for the completion of the work will be instantly available and the work will be pushed as rapidly as possible and doubtless completed within a very few months."

NOTICE OF BOND LECTION

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held at the Beare building in the town of Eldorado, Texas, within the Eldorado Independent School District, on the 10th day of April, 1920, to determine whether the bonds of said district shall be issued to the amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) payable serially as follows, to wit: seven hundred fifty dollars on the 10th day of April, 1921, and seven hundred fifty dollars on the 10th day of April, each and every year thereafter to and including the year 1960, and bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum payable annually for the purpose of constructing and equipping a public free school building of brick and tile material, purchasing a site therefor, within said district, and for the purpose of constructing permanent repairs to the present brick and stone public free school building of said district, and whether there shall be annually levied, assessed and collected on all the taxable property in said district, for the current year and annually thereafter while said bonds, or any of them, are outstanding, a tax sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

L. M. Hoover has been appointed manager of said election, which shall be held as nearly as may be possible in conformity with the general election laws of the State. No person shall vote at said election unless he be a qualified voter under the Constitution and laws of this State, and a tax payer in the said Eldorado Independent School District.

Those in favor of the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots, "For the bonds and the tax"; and those against the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots, "Against the bonds and the tax".

Said election was ordered by the board of trustees of said Eldorado Independent School District, by order passed on the 6th day of March, 1920, and this notice is issued pursuant to said order.

The defeat of the old board apparently means the defeat of the bond issue and the defeat of the bonds will necessarily mean a higher tax for school purposes for the next few years as the temporary work necessary to maintain the school at its present standing will create a larger tax than the interest on the bond will create.

The Success does not believe the newly elected trustees will allow the school to go backward as each man is interested in the school and are not likely to let the school suffer for finances, this will be the job of the new board, the old has placed the school where there is no need of it being without finances. The new board will not be able to fix the salary of teacher below the present prices and its very doubtful if the same positions can be refilled at the prices now paid. We have served with 3 of the new board in the past and know that they stood for the best school possible, with competent teachers and we see no reason why they, who all have children in school could be otherwise, we can not agree on teachers but new teachers will not reduce the expense, the old teachers should have better pay and can get better pay elsewhere. Our sympathy is with the school board, they are public officials who's acts come in contact with every home in the community also comes in contact with every pocket book in the district, as public officials their acts are open for criticism, and "sometimes" are criticised. We thank the people most heartily for the kindness shown us Saturday in casting your vote against us.

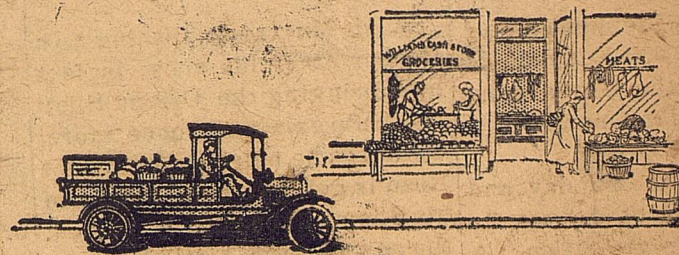

SOME FACTS AND FANCIES ABOUT THE PHILIPPINES

There Has Been Much Misrepresentation in America About People and Conditions.

By MAXIMO M. KALAW, Secretary of the Philippine Mission.

A certain lady at the St. Louis Exposition saw at a ball room a brown complexioned man in faultless evening dress and accosted him with the inquiry, "I suppose you are Japanese, sir?" The man addressed replied, "No, madam." "Then you must be Chinese," she said.

"No, I am not. I am a Filipino," he replied. "How's that?" asked the lady. "I thought they were all savages living in the woods."

"Well, I'll tell you how I came here," he said. "A month before I left the Philippines I was living in the woods, but the American Governor decided to catch as many wild men as possible, train them and send them over here. So here I am, just as you see." And the St. Louis lady actually believed him.

That is what you would call fancies about the Philippines. The fact is, however, that the 11,000,000 Filipinos and their ancestors have been civilized and Christians for 300 years; that the non-Christian population, according to the census of 1918, is only 600,000, and even these are not all uncivilized.

Another fancy is that not until the coming of the Americans were school buildings seen in the Islands, roads built, or substantial houses erected. Do you know that for hundreds of years the Filipinos have had colleges and schools and that the University of Santo Tomas is only twenty-five years older than Harvard? That as early as 1835, out of a population of 4,000,000 people, there were 841 schools for boys and 833 for girls? That in 1892, eight years before the coming of the Americans, there were 2,137 schools?

To grant self-government to Luzon under Aguinaldo would be like granting self-government to an Apache reservation under some local chief." Thus spoke a former President of the United States during the Filipino-American war. Exaggeration could be an excuse at a time when the dignity of the American people demanded the extinction of Filipino opposition, but do you know that the Philippine Republic, before the American occupation of the Islands, had the approval of prominent Americans who were on the spot—like John Barrett, Director of the Pan-American Union, who compared it favorably with the Japanese government? That Admiral Dewey considered the Filipinos better fitted for self-government than the Cubans? That they had drafted a constitution at Malolos which elicited the approval of distinguished Republicans like the late Senator George F. Hoar? That before the coming of the Americans they had produced national heroes like the martyred Jose Rizal, pronounced by a Republican congressman, Representative Cooper, as the noblest victim that has ever fallen into the clutches of tyranny?

And do you know that the Filipinos have not had for hundreds of years any caste system, blood distinction or royal families, and that, unlike their oriental sisters, they are the only Christian people in the Orient?

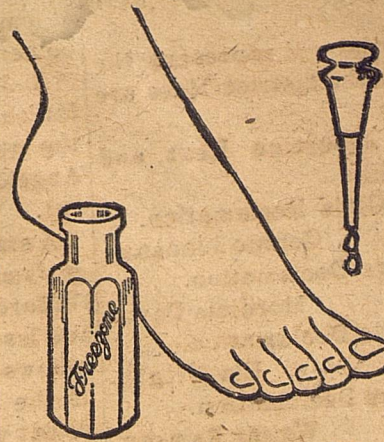
People have pictured an ignorant mass of Filipinos, illiterate, poor, living a life of servitude for a few wealthy land owners and foreigners, with no houses or farms or property of their own. Do you know that 70 per cent. of the people above ten years of age can read and write and that this percentage of literacy is almost as high as some of the states of the Union? That it is higher than in any country of South America, higher than the literacy of the Spanish people, and unquestionably above that of any of the new countries recognized in Europe? Do you know that there are a million and a half farms in the Philippines and that 98 per cent. of these farms are owned by Filipinos. In other words, that out of the 11,000,000 Christian Filipinos, 8,000,000 of them at least live on their own farms, with houses of their own, independent of any absentee landlord or foreign master? That 91 per cent. of the urban property consisting of houses and lands is owned by the natives of the Philippines, and only 9 per cent. is in the hands of foreigners? Yet these are facts cabled by Acting Governor Charles Emmett Yeater to the War Department from the recent census estimates.

Having solemnly promised the Filipinos their independence and having gone before the world as the champion of self-determination, the Filipino people cannot understand how America can consistently refuse to make good these promises.

FARMER'S INCOME SUBJECT TO TAX

Gains for 1919 Must Be Figured Under U. S. Law—Returns Due March 15.

LAND SALE PROFITS TAXABLE.

Necessary Farm Expenses May Be Deducted—Special Form for Farm Income—Cash or Accrual Basis for Computing.

A farmer, shopkeeper, or tradesman must figure up his net income for 1919; and if the farm or business income plus his other income was sufficient to require an income tax return a complete return must be filed with the collector of internal revenue by March 15.

A farmer should ascertain the gross income of his farm by computing all gains derived from the sale or exchange of his products, whether produced on the farm or purchased and resold.

Farm Expenses.

From his gross income a farmer is allowed to charge off all of his necessary expenses in the conduct of the farm during the year. These include costs of planting, cultivating, harvesting and marketing. In addition to these costs he may deduct money spent for ordinary farm tools of short life bought during the year, such as shovels, rakes, etc. Also, the cost of feed purchased for his live stock may be treated as an expense in so far as this cost represents actual outlay, but the value of his own products fed to animals is not a deductible item.

Other farm expenses allowable are the cost of minor repairs on buildings (but not the dwelling house), on fences, wagons and farm machinery; also bills paid for horseshoeing, stock powders, rock salt, services of veterinary, insurance (except on dwelling house), gasoline for operating power and sundry other expenses which were paid for in cash.

As to hired help, all the productive labor is a deductible expense; but the wages of household servants, or help hired to improve the farm, as in tree planting, ditching, etc., cannot be claimed against earnings. A farmer is not allowed to claim a salary for himself or members of his family who work on the farm.

Wear and Tear.

Purchase of farm machinery, wagons, work animals, etc., also the cost of construction or extension of buildings, silos, fencing, etc., should be considered additional investments in the farm and are not proper deductions against income.

A reasonable allowance may be claimed for wear and tear on farm buildings (except the farmhouse), fences, machinery, work animals, wagons, tanks, windmills and other farm equipment which is used in the conduct of the farm.

As to autos and tractors, the cost of these is not an expense, although the cost of their upkeep is an allowable deduction, if the machines are used exclusively for farm purposes and not for pleasure. Also, in such cases, a deduction for wear and tear is allowed.

Farm Losses.

The loss of a growing crop is not a proper deduction from income, inasmuch as the value of the crop had not been taken into gross income. The loss of a building or of machinery through storm, lightning, flood, etc., is an allowable deduction, but care should be used to ascertain the correct loss sustained, as restricted by income tax regulations.

No deduction is allowed in the case of loss of animals raised on the farm, but a loss is deductible from gross income if the animals had been purchased for draft or breeding purposes.

Shrinkage in weight or value of farm products held for favorable market prices cannot be deducted as a loss, for the reason that when such products are sold the shrinkage will be reflected in the selling price.

Sale of Farms and Land.

The value of agricultural lands has been jumping during the past few years, and during 1919 many owners sold out part or all of their lands at big profits. All such gains constitute income and must be taken into the net income for the year.

Any person who sold part of a farm or ranch, or part of a parcel of land must also show any gains realized by the sale.

The method of figuring gains and losses on such transactions is prescribed in the Income Tax regulations, copies of which may be secured from Internal Revenue Collectors.

Forms for Returns.

The Internal Revenue Bureau has issued an improved Form 1040F for the use of farmers. This form, together with Form 1040A or 1040, will give the farmer explicit information as to how to properly figure his net income for 1919.

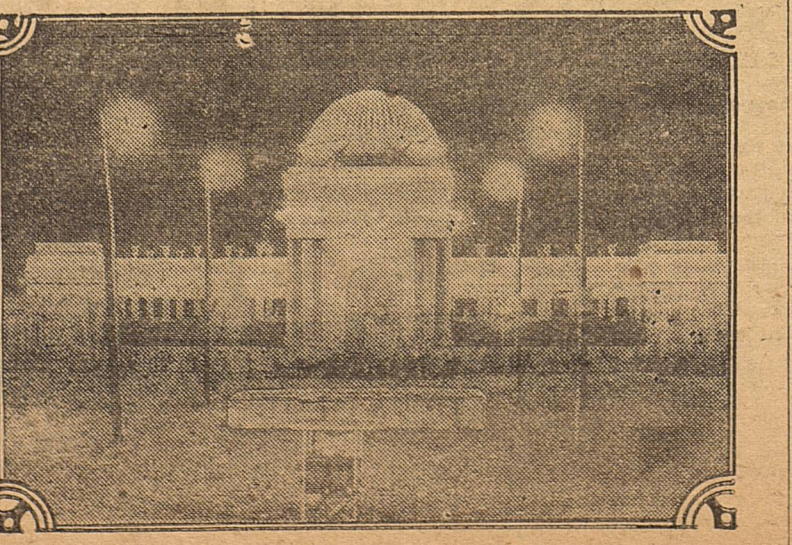

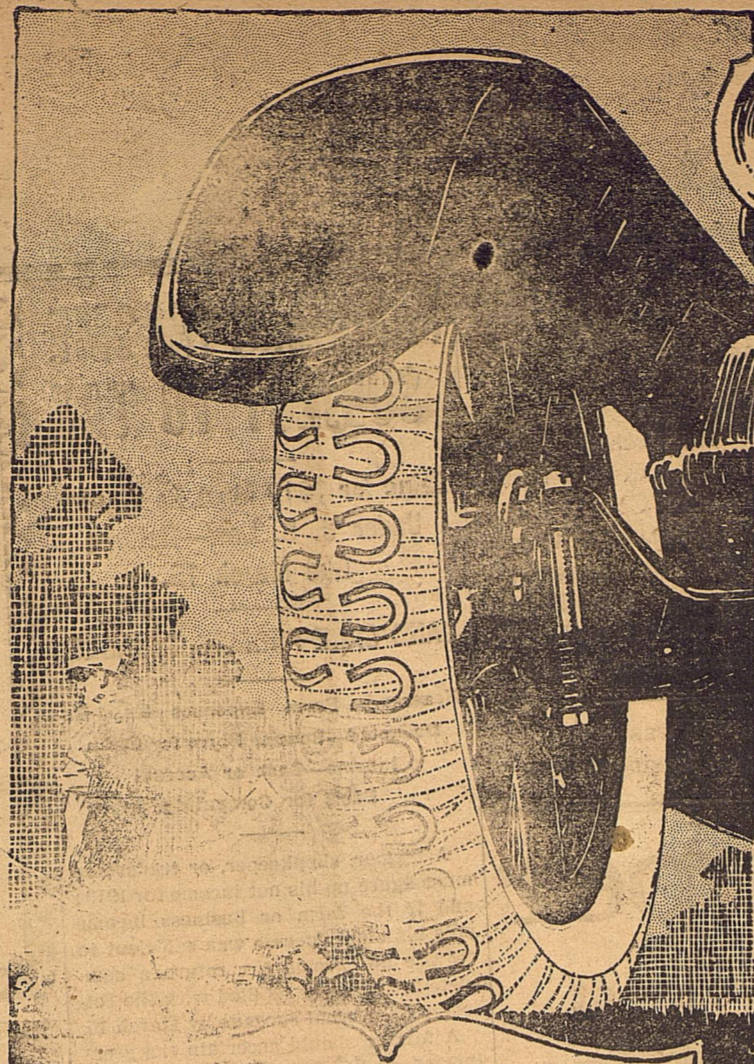

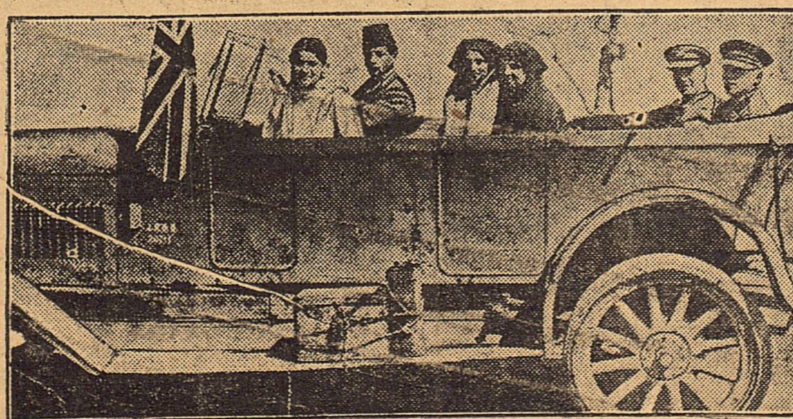
