Neff, of Waco, candidate for governor, spoke to a large audience Saturday morning at the Baptist church, and during his speech he received much applause and we think from the way he presented his case he added some to his already strong following here. At no time did he mention any of his opponents but pitched his campaign on a high christian plain, which pleased his hearers.

Mr. Neff is the second candidate for governor that ever visited Eldorado and the audience seemed to appreciate the fact that he made the effort to speak to them.

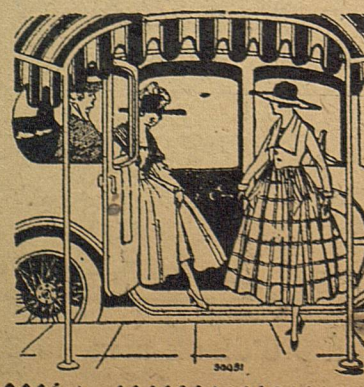

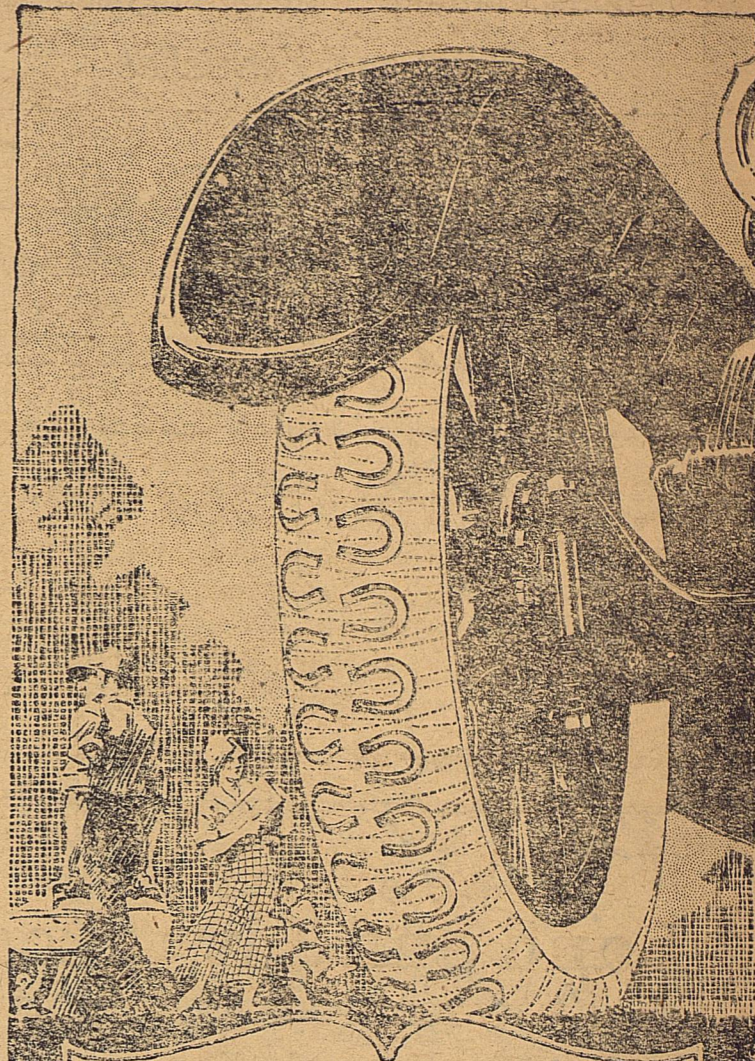

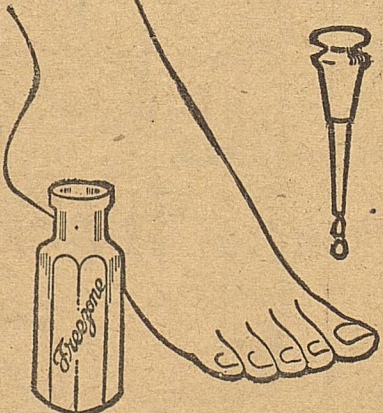
