SOUTHERN BAPTIST **CONVENTION CLOSES**

LARGEST RELIGIOUS ASSEMBL IN COUNTRY PLANS FU-TURE PROGRAM.

The seventy-fifth annual session of the Southern Baptist Convention, which has just recently closed in day tabernacle, where the sessions of the convention were held. The atten-dance was so great that as many as three simultaneous overflow meetings were being held in different auditoriums of the city, Liberty Hut not being able to handle half the crowds. Texas, though on the Western outskirts of the convention territory, was represented by more than 1,000 dele-

Texas Man Re-Elected President. Texas, was reelected for the fourth consecutive year as president of the body, thus breaking a twenty year precedent that no person shall serve the convention as president more than three years. His election is regarded as significant as indicating that Southern Baptists have not changed in their attitude respecting the Inter church World Movement in declining to enter the movement. Dr. Gambrell has been the spokesman for the de nomination in expressions concerning the Inter-church World Movement, and his re-election is recognition of his continued leadership among South

Convention Addressed By Vice-Presi dent Marshall. Vice-President of the United States, Thomas R. Marshall, in an address of welcome to the Baptists on behalf of the Government, pleaded for the fuller acceptance of Jesus Christ in the minds and hearts of individual men and women, and added that it was his conviction that peace would never come to the world unless founded upon the teachings and principles of the lowly Nazarene. In his address Mr. Marshall paid his respects to churches that had forgotten to preach the gospel and were trying to reform the anchors of safety for the nation.

Letter From President Read. During the proceedings of the Condent Wilson was read:

THE WHITE HOUSE Washington, May 12, 1920. My Dear Dr. Tupper It is a matter of genuine and very deep regret on my part that I cannot personally greet the members of the senator Dudley. Southern Baptist Convention now gathering to hold the Diamond Anniversa ering to hold the Diamond Anniversary Convention in this city. It would be a great pleasure to me, if I could meet the members personally and express my deep concern in all the great interests which they represent. It is of special significance and timeliness the nation now faces nothing less than the question whether it is to help Christian people in other parts of the world to realize their ideals of justice and of ordered peace. And I am sure that the nation will listen with the greatest deference to the utterances

of the Convention.

Cordially and sincerely yours, Texas, General Director of the Baptist 75 Million Campaign, made his final report on the results of the drive. The official figures reached a total of \$92, 630,923. The expenses of the campaign living. for raising this huge sum were remarkably low, being less than three-fourths of one per cent. Following the report a committee, consisting of one member from each state, and headed by Dr. F. S. Groner, of Dallas, Texas, was appointed to make recommendations for the program during the next four years of the five-year campaign.

Truett Addresses 10,000 From The climax of the convention was reached in an address by Dr. Geo. W. Truett of Dallas, Texas, delivered from the steps of the east entrance of the Capitol, overlooking the spot where the presidential inaugurations are held. Dr. Truett spoke on Baptists and Civil and Religious Liberty to an audience estimated at ten thousand, which frequently cheered him during and satisfies all who use them. his references to the League of Nations and to President Wilson. "Standing in the shadow of the Senate Chamber," said Dr. Truett, "I declare that the moral forces of the country, without regard to political party, regard the delay on the League of Nations a national and world and residuals. national and world-wide tragedy. 

Relief will make to the country in February for funds to support its work among the starving peoples of that stricken land. To the Washington meeting he wrote: "Advices and information coming

from the Near East cannot be doubted. There is great actual suffering and famine. These people, recently become independent and released from bitter thraldom, cannot support themselves. And the Christian and common instincts of humanity which have prompted the people of the United States during the last two years to relieve the distress and needs, especially of the Near East, must not be allowed to grow cold and be diminished.

"I hope we shall all unite in this present emergency and be able to collect sufficient funds to enable these peoples to live and work until next summer brings them permanent relief and subsistence. I call upon all to respond generously to the appeal now being made and trust that the committee will be gratified with the results."
