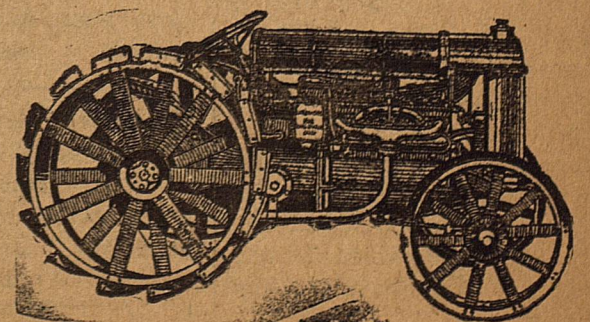

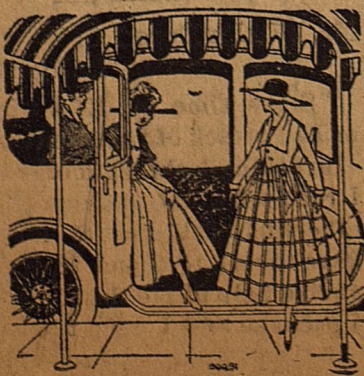

**TEXAS STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION WILL AID U. S. SAVINGS CAMPAIGN**

Austin, Texas—Cooperation between the State Department of Education of Texas and the Savings Division of the United States Treasury Department for the Eleventh Federal Reserve District for the coming year has been placed on a definite basis. Miss Annie Webb Blanton, State Superintendent, approved the program proposed for the school by the Savings Division, assigning a Supervisor to prepare material the Savings Division will furnish teachers.

Representatives of the State Department of Education have presented the Division's school plans to institutes in which teachers of about one hundred counties were assembled during the first week of September. S. M. N. Marrs, Chief Supervisor of High Schools, read the program to teachers of fourteen counties in joint institutes at Canyon; Assistant Superintendent E. L. Dohoney, explained the plan at Victoria, Huntsville and Beaumont and other institutes visited. L. D. Borden, Chief Supervisor of Rural Schools, included it in his speeches at Beeville, Woodville, Orange and other institutes. W. E. James, Rural School Supervisor presented the matter to institutes at Waxahachie, Hillsboro, Marshall and other cities.

"Earn, save and invest," said Peyton Irving, Jr., Director's assistant for Education for the Division, "is the slogan. Pupils are taught how to care for their business affairs as well as their language, their morals and their physical welfare. They must know it is a privilege, a blessing as well as a duty, to work. They must come to feel intuitively, that they must live on less than they earn, and put away savings for future needs; otherwise they face dependency or crime. It is the duty of teachers to see these teachings fruit into action. Savings Securities, Thrift Stamps, War Savings Stamps of the government, and savings banks are to be recommended for pupils to use in preserving and increasing their savings."

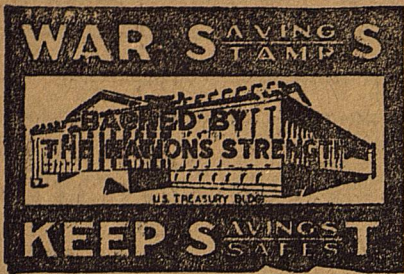

SPECIALISTS PREPARING  
OUTLINES FOR SCHOOLS  
FOR SAVINGS DIVISION

Dallas, Texas.—Valuable sugges-  
tions, in the form of outlines, will be  
furnished to teachers of the Eleventh  
Federal Reserve District to aid them  
in conducting the "earn, save and in-  
vest" campaign of the government in  
the schools this year, according to  
Dinsmore W. Hume, Federal District  
Director.

Material for primary grades will be  
prepared for the Division by Mrs.  
Ella F. Little, Primary Supervisor of  
Rural Schools, of the State Depart-  
ment of Education of Texas," said Mr.  
Hume. "A specialist in elementary  
school work will prepare suggestions  
to be sent teachers of fourth, fifth,  
sixth and seventh grades, to be used  
in connection with either language or  
history recitations, or both. Mr. L. H.  
Hubbard, Superintendent of City  
Schools, Belton, Texas, will prepare  
matter for use by high school pupils  
in their English classes. Negotiations  
are under way for a specialist in his-  
tory to furnish the Division outlines  
for use of high school classes and  
teachers of history.

"These suggestions will be usable in  
high school classes already organized;  
additional classes or periods will not  
be necessary. They will relate to mat-  
ters discussed in text books, offer in-  
teresting side lights on topics there  
presented and show how they natu-  
rally develop into approval of the  
principles promulgated by the Savings  
Division. They are simple: earn  
something, live on something less,  
save; invest, put your savings where  
they are safe and earn something.  
When school children do this they will  
find Thrift Stamps, War Savings  
Stamps and Registered Treasury Sav-  
ings Certificates most convenient in  
denomination, and safe, savings ac-  
counts in banks also meet with ap-  
proval of this campaign."

LABOR ORGANIZATIONS  
URGE FUNDS BE PLACED  
IN U. S. SECURITIES

Montreal, Canada.—The Fortieth  
Convention of the American Federa-  
tion of Labor, by unanimous vote, de-  
clared regular and systematic invest-  
ment in Government securities a part  
of its permanent policy for the benefit  
of its members and the welfare of the  
country. The resolution bearing on  
this subject reads in part: "The  
American Federation of Labor reit-  
erates its former endorsement and  
approval of the plan of the Savings  
Division of the United States Treas-  
ury Department now being operated  
in each of the Federal Reserve Dis-  
tricts.

"All International Unions and Fed-  
eral Unions are urged to advocate  
Thrift Stamps, War Savings Stamps  
and Registered Treasury Savings  
Certificates as the best and safest  
method for saving and investment  
their members can adopt, against the  
schemes of those who are now under-  
taking to take advantage of the Gov-  
ernment's savings program and the  
savings habit formed during the war  
by introducing thrift systems in in-  
dustry, through which they will make  
a profit from the savings of workers."

The convention also recommended  
local unions place their funds in gov-  
ernment securities, buy Liberty and  
Victory Notes and hold them to ma-  
turity. The convention's final reso-  
lution asked that the government con-  
tinue and extend the savings work  
through each of the Federal Reserve  
Districts.
