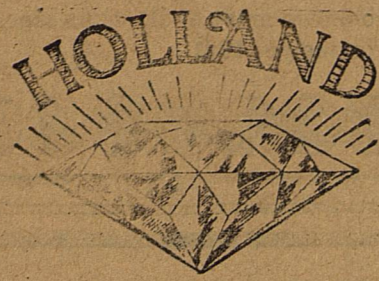

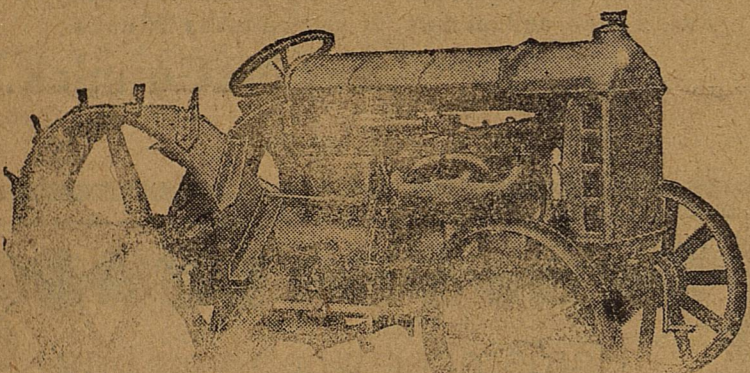

LET'S BUILD ELDORADO AND DO IT NOW.

The citizens of Eldorado make or ruin its property. Eldorado is not like Old Uncle Tom's Topsy. It won't "jist grow". It has to be cared for like a hot house plant. Its people must talk its advantages, push its good points, and set forth its location and adaptiveness for farming, stockraising and its good school.

Weeds spring up unseen and flourish unattended, but a field of corn must be cultivated. So it is with Eldorado. Someone must work to pull the community out of the slough of lifelessness.

Eldorado is a live because its citizens are a live. The more people they put into their jobs, the better for the place. Three or four good workers can raise a town from the dead. In the past 15 years cross-roads settlements have become flourishing villages, moribund villages have grown into the city class. Regardless of natural advantages somebody hustled to bring about the growth in each instant.

WOOL AT 14 3-4 AND 25 1-2.

Tom Henderson, one of Schleichner's largest wool growers, was in the city Wednesday from his ranch and reports the sale of 14,000 pounds of long wool at Boston at 25 1-2 cents per pound, the commission and freight to be paid out of this.

Mr. Henderson also sold 26,000 pounds of short wool which net him 14 3-4 cents less 2 1-2 cents commission.

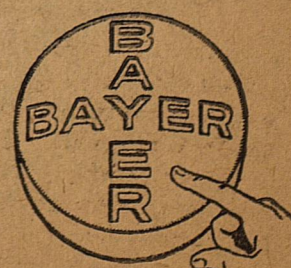

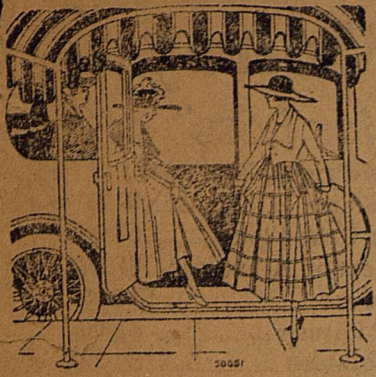

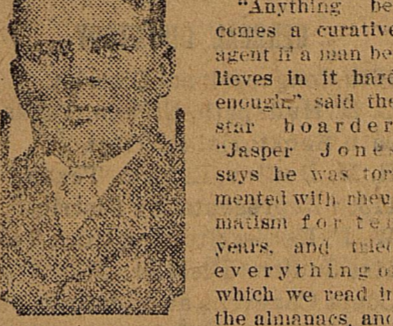
