

Relative to House Bill No. 156, copy of which is being sent you by the Secretary of State, the Attorney General holds that said bill can not become effective until ninety days after adjournment of the Legislature, for the reason that it failed to receive the tow-thirds majority vote necessary to make it become effective at once.

Ninety days after adjournment will, in all probability, be the middle of June, therefore, no change in the law will take place prior to that time, and you are advised to collect the ten per cent penalty which applies on the first of February, as if no law had been passed.



On Feb. 26, our places of residence will be inspected by a committee representing the new board of health and if we have not com plied with the requirements we will be personally interviewed by them relative to the cond tion of our places. Let us not be "weighed in the balance and found wanting." If we fail in this work, civic pride alone has not been sacrificed buy personal pride as well. May it not be said of any citizen of Eldorado that they had to be urged to clean up their premises. Now


