### BLANTON DEFENDS CONGRESS RECORDS AT BALLINGER.

Representative Thomas L. Blanton, addressing a crowd which filled the district court room at Ballinger Thursday night Nov. 24, reviewed his record in the House, the recent attempt to expel him and declared he could better serve his constituents in the Senate and would make the race if the "people pledge their indorsement." After speaking more than two hours, his audience, by a rising vote, almost unanimously indorsed his Senatorial aspirations.

Blanton quoted from the Congressional Record, Washington newspapers, labor journals and the press at large to show how he said he had blocked extravagant legislation. Concerning the attempt to expel him, the speaker declared Congress attempted to kick him out without "a dog's chance." He asserted that Victor Berger, charged with being a "traitor to his country" was given three months to get evidence in his behalf, while he (Blanton) virtually had been denied a hearing.

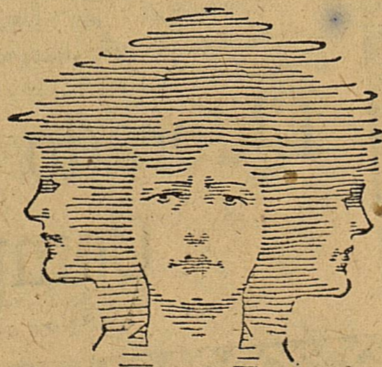

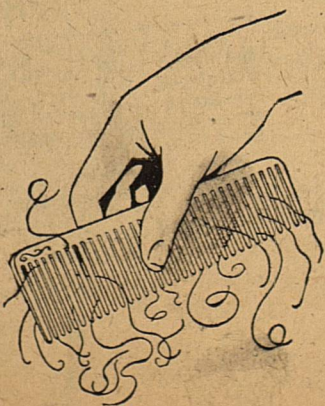
