### SHEEPMEN HELD MEETING

SATURDAY

The Sheepmen of Schleicher County met in the directors room of the First National Bank with 14 men present, the meeting was called to order by J. A. Whitten and the object of the meeting stated.

A. P. Bailey was elected president, and A. T. Wright secretary of the meeting.

The object of the meeting was to agree if possible what was to be paid for shearing, Mr. Whitten and T. K. Jones announced they had offers to get their sheep sheared for eight cents per head others reported that Ozona was contracting for eight cents and Sonora nine.

Tom Smith and Domingo, two of Schleichers shearers were present and each declared they could not and would not shear for eight cents, the meeting then voted not to pay but eight cents for shearing.

The meeting then discussed the wolf problem, it was the opinion of all, that the county should organize to make a fight to exterminate the wolves, so it was decided to meet again on Saturday March 4, to further discuss this proposition and try to secure a trapper for this county. This meeting will be at 3:30 at Bank.
