N. C. HUDGENS KILLED

AT SWEETWATER

The Success Editor received a telegram Friday morning that his brother-in-law, Nich C. Hudgens, of San Angelo, was killed at Sweetwater, Texas, in the early morning hours Friday, he was breakman on the Orient and the supposition is that he was knocked from the top of the car by the funnel from the water tank in the darkness, falling between two cars, the train passing over his body, severing his legs both above and below the knees. He lived only a few minutes after the accident.

Mr. Hudgens was 48 years old and has been working on the Orient for the past 10 or 12 years. He at one time lived in our city and owned the Black-Smith and Machine Shop here, which burned when the Barbee & Isaacs Hardware burned, he is known by many of the older settlers here. He moved to San Angelo where he has resided since and leaves a wife and several children, with one yet to be, to miss his fatherly guidance and care, he has two children who have passed on to the realms of glory to await his coming. The children who survive him are Marie, Melvin, Alvin, Glenn, Nola, Ray and Edward.

Mrs. Hudgens is the only daughter of Mr. G. M. Holland of Christoval.

The father of Mr. Hudgens also an only sister, lives at Spiva Tenn, the father being very low at the time of his sons death.

The remains of Mr. Hudgens was laid to rest in the Odd-Fellow addition to Fairmount Cemetery under the auspices of the order, Rev. J. M. Hamby the family pastor conducted the services at the home, the floral offering was most beautiful and covered the newly made mound when placed there at the cemetery.
