ELDORADO GETS ONE HALF INCH, OTHER PLACES MORE.

West Texas was visited by a rain Saturday morning, amounting to one half inch in Eldorado, 75-100 in McKavett, Christoval, Ozona, 85-100 at Sonora, and Mertzon, San Angelo and most of West Texas reports rain, the Sheffield country reports three inches. Mr. Ben Hext returned from Cross Plains Sunday he reports that all the section between here and there had rain, at Cross Plains three inches fell.

The precipitation was sufficient to start the grass and will soon relieve the stockmen of their enormous feed bill that they have been undergoing for the past two months, upon which they have been fleeced by the sharks who control the production of which they were forced to buy. Indications are good for more rain and with it will revive the great Stock Industry of West Texas, not however to the high expectation of some, but sufficient to save the live stock industry of the country as a whole.

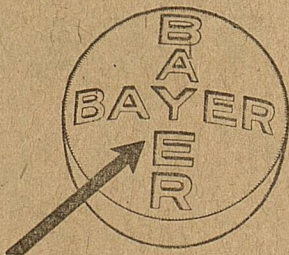

Grandjury adjourned Wednesday without finding any bills.

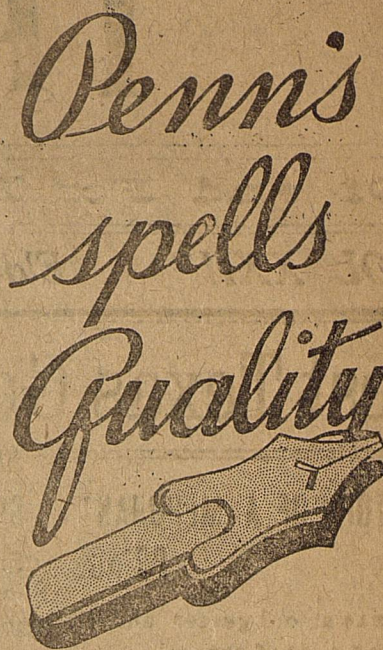

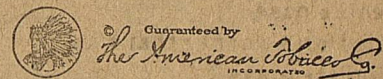

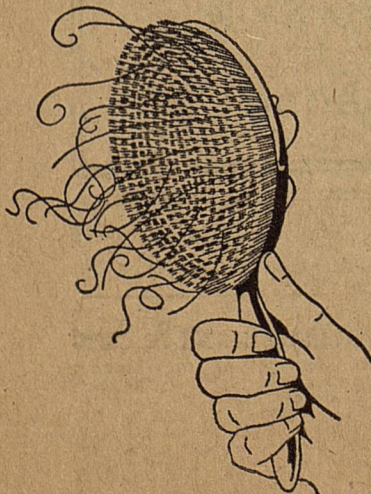
