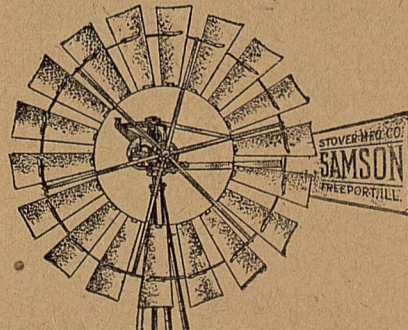

OUR LEGISLATURE

Probably there is nothing more amusing than to watch our state legislature in session and listen to the speeches of various representatives. First of all it is note worthy how many men are willing to sacrifice their time for the mere consideration of five dollars a day. Five dollars a day would not be a bad salary if the session were longer and more frequent, but to serve sixty days in two years for five dollars a day is very little remuneration for such important service. Due to this lack of pay we are unable to have the most capable men as our representatives, and the incapable men are the sources of the amusement of which I spoke.

The faults that I find with our representatives are not their willingness or unwillingness to function properly, but it is their inability. They are not far sighted and progressive, and are rather skeptic of those persons who advocate progress. An illustration of their unprogressiveness is their failure to build and maintain a state University with adequate facilities. An example of their skepticism is their criticism of President Vinson who advocates the building of a first class University.

I do not mean to criticize harshly the work done by our legislature. It is not altogether its fault. These men who compose our senate and house are elected by the people of the district which they represent. They are elected usually on condition that they reduce taxes and reimburse the treasury. If they vote contrary to the wishes of the people they would not only lose their position at the next election, but would be betraying the trust placed in them.

But how shall we remedy this evil? Speeches made to ignorant people fall on deaf ears when higher taxes are advocated. The people of the backwoods live comfortably under any regime so why should they be burdened with higher taxes. Their money is the fruit of hard labor and they are unwilling to part with it except for benefits to themselves. These honest sons of the soil care not for education or refinement. Their wagons, it is true, make more noise on rough roads than on pavements, but every country gentleman is accustomed to the noise made by such common vehicles. Their children have few educational advantages, but very little education is required to be a farmer, stock raiser, or day laborer.

It is the people who do not desire refinement and the people who reap great profits by the work of others who keep the state and nation in a backward state of civilization. The wise man can be convinced that he is wrong but the fool can see only one side of the question. So it is with a great many of our representatives. They cannot be convinced that they are wrong. I have known our legislators to talk for hours on trial subjects, while subjects that were vital to the state were not discussed

I have known others who energetic statesmen. Such men did nothing more than criticize as these are not even good the work being done by the more sports.—Contributed.

DR. FRANK J. NORRIS

"TEXAS TORNADO."

Below is a portion of a sermon delivered in New York by Rev. Frank J. Norris, Pastor of a Ft. Worth Baptist church, taken from the Dallas Times-Herald.

New York, April 1.—"Every great war has been traced to the depavity of the women and they never were as bad as they are today," says Dr. Frank J. Norris of Fort Worth, "Texas Tornado," revivalist, who is conducting services at Calvary Baptist church. "The cause of the next war struts up Fifth avenue today and her sister out on Main street apes her. The flapper will bring about this country's downfall just as Delilah caused Sampson's. Our statesmen are scrapping the battleships, they ought to be slapping the flapper."

"When a woman shows her knees, you can see her finish and that of the nation as well," Rev. Norris said. "Girls think more of their eyelashes and nude hosiery than they do of decency. Home life is broken up, respect for law goes with it; wholesale iniquity follows, then—war."

"We cursed the kaiser for starting the last war, but we 'pet' the cause of the next."

"If I had my way, every girl under age would be in bed by nine o'clock."

"The modern girl is one hundred times worse than the girl of the last century and the country girl is just as bad as her city cousin."

"Once upon a time country girls were pure, but gasoline spoiled that. We have closed up our red light districts and put them on rubber tires."

"Women who smoke are indecent. The spark from a woman's cigarette is going to touch off a conflagration that will destroy this country within fifty years."

"Jezebel was the worst woman in the world. She was the queen of the 'shifters.' The last thing she did before she died was to paint her face, and then the dogs ate her."

The Travis County grand jury reconvened Thursday and it is understood will continue its investigation into the alleged activities of the Ku Klux Klan.

F. G. Reynolds, clerk of a fraternal organization, whose contempt of court case for refusal to answer questions by the grand jury about the Ku Klux Klan was upheld by the Court of Criminal appeals, declared today, "we will go to jail before we will answer the question" He said he was also speaking for J. D. Copeland, police commissioner, who is likewise held in contempt. "We consider the question an infringement upon our personal liberties and safety," he said.

The consul for Copeland and Reynolds announced their intention of filing for a rehearing yesterday as soon as the decision on the appeal became known. In event a rehearing is refused they say they will file an application for a writ of error to the Supreme Court of the United States.
