



Some years ago, a shudder spread over the continent at a proposition, for the relief (f agriculture, that government provide storage for grain creps intil a glutted market could be elieved and prices resumed normality The thing was not to be thought of. Financial urcles led the live and cry against such paternalism, and the matter was dropped. The farmer, since as before, has ogen left to the mercy of the elevator interests, with what result he can tell you.

The recent change in the direc. torship of the United States mint required an inventory, which shows that Uncle Sam is providing storage for about three pillions of dollars in gold owned by private interists, for which it furnishes paper money muchnore convenient to use. This gold, in coin and bullion, aggregates a third of the estimated world supply, and does not inlude that "in circulation" in the vaults of banker as reserve. Besides the gold holdings, there tre 676 millions of silver and other assets in the various vaults of the mint service.

The difference between the storage of the farmer's grain and the banker's gold would be hard to distinguish, yet one is
