LOUIS HOPKINS DIES OF GUN SHOT WOUND

Louis Hopkins died at the ranch of Mrs. Sheen Monday at 6:30 p. m., from the gun shot wound he received in a shooting affray between himself and Davis Sheen on Monday evening April 17th, in which Mr. Sheen was also slightly wounded, and is now out on bond.

Louis Hopkins is a son of F. M. Hopkins of Voca Texas, but has been residing in the Rudd neighborhood this county for 10 or 12 years, an employe on the S. C. Martin ranch, he has lived a peaceful life and was 36 years old. Mr. Hopkins came to the Sheen ranch about the first of this year, Mrs. Sheen being a daughter of Mrs. Martin.

Upon learning of the death of Mr. Hopkins Sheriff Luedécke phoned the officers at San Angelo to re-arrest Mr. Sheen which was done and he was placed under a \$5,000 bond, the signers being Davis Sheen, L. L. Farr and J. S. Allison.

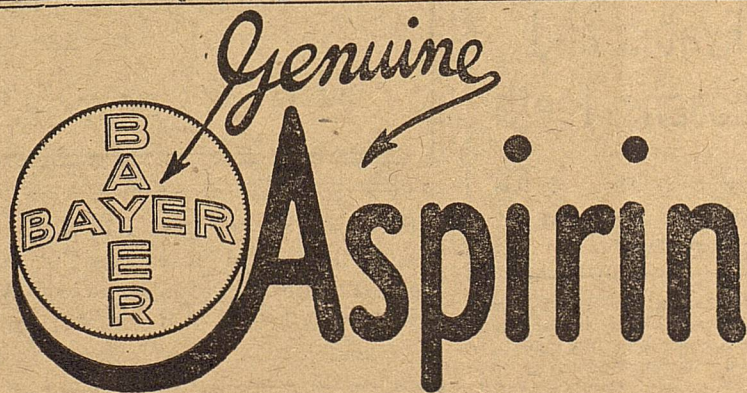

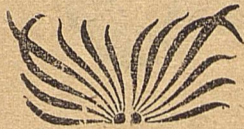
