

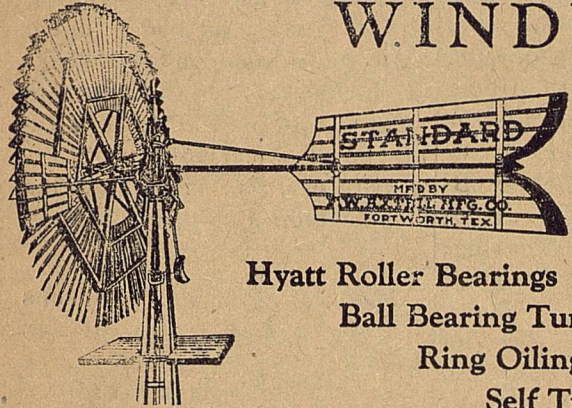

### ROBERT L. HENRY DELIVERS ADDRESS AT GATESVILLE.

At Gatesville, Texas, Robert L. Henry spoke in the interest of his candidacy for the United States Senate. The address was delivered in the District Court room and both the lower floor and the balcony were filled. His speech was in line with many others made over the State. During the address he was enthusiastically applauded, and especially so when he referred to the Klan and his opposition to unrestricted foreign immigration.

He opposed the cancellation of any part of the foreign debt due the United States and said he favored its collection and a distribution of at least \$5,000,000,000 among the ex-service men of the country.

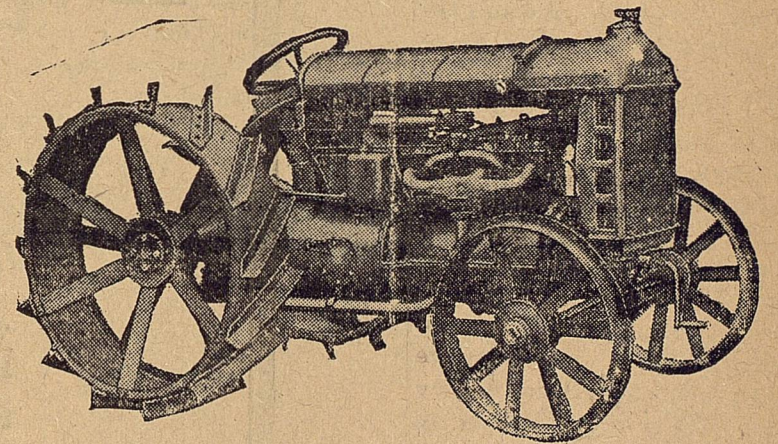

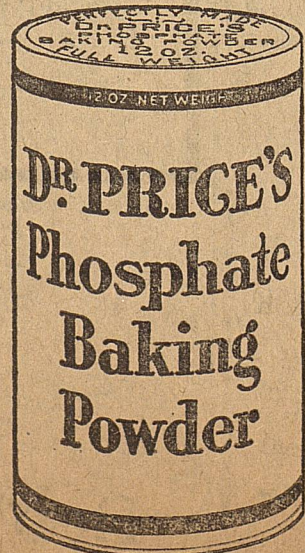

## JOHN GEORGE MURPHY

J. G. Murphy, former publisher and editor of the San Angelo Standard and one of the County Commissioners, died Thursday morning at his home in San Angelo. Mr Murphy has been one of the most influential men in the building up of West Texas, and no man is probably better known, but his life of usefulness has ended but his good works will live on after him. He never tired of boosting West Texas although the adversities sometimes came thick. He was 34 years old and lived in San Angelo since the early 80's and everybody knew him by name of "Pat," he is survived by a wife and daughter 17 years old.

About 42 years ago three Irish lads just grown into man hood came to San Angelo, "Pat" Murphey, "Mike" Murphey and Steve Murphey, they engaged in the newspaper business and have been instrumental in developing the great west. To-day Pat and Mike are resting beneath the sod of the country they have helped to develop from the wild and woolly west to a land of paradise.

The San Angelo Standard will on July 16 issue a Memorial Edition honoring J. G. (Pat) Murphey. Mike and Steve have just their lot with the people of Sutton county where Mike is buried. Steve now editor and owner of the Devil's River News is all that is left of the three. Full of his Irish wit Steve says he will never die.

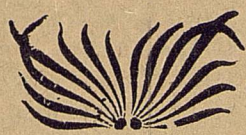
