

Miss Madie was an excellent scholar in our school and we are confident that she made good in her college work.





JOHN GEORGE MURPHY

J.G. Murphy, former publisher and editor of the San Angelo Standard and one of the County Commissioners, died Thursday morning at his home in San Angelo. Mr Murphy has been one of the most influntial men in the building up of West Texas, and no man 1s probably better known, but his life of usefulness has ended but his good works willlive on after him. he never tired of boosting West Fexas although the adversities sometimes came thick. He was 54 years old and lived in San Angelo since the early 80's and every body knew him by name of "Pat," he is survived by a wife and daughter 17 years old. About 42 years ago three Irish lads just grown into man hood came to San Angelo, "Pat" Murphey, "Mike" Murphey and 3⁺eve Murphey, they engaged in the newspaper business and have been instrumental in developing the great west. To-day Pat and Mike are resting beneath the sod of the country they have helped to develop from the wild and wooly west to a land of paradize.

The San Angelo Standard will on July 16 issue a Memorial Elition honoring J. G. (Pat) Murphey. Mike and Steve have sist their lot with the people of Sutton county where Mike is barried. Steve now editor and owner of the Devil's River News is all that is left of the three. Full of his Irish wit Steve says he will never die.
