INFORMATION AS TO ABSENTEE VOTING IS GIVEN

Any qualified voter, at any time between July 12th and July 20th who expects to be away from the county in which they desire to vote, may make their appearance before the county clerk of their county, deliver his or her poll tax receipt, or make affidavit that such has been paid, receive an official ballot for such primary election.

Also, any qualified voter who is away from their place of residence may, between July 2nd and July 12th, make their personal appearance before a notary public and deliver to such notary their poll tax receipt or make affidavit that such be properly paid, which poll tax or affidavit shall be mailed by such Notary public to the county clerk of such county where the elector resides, who shall verify such and mail to such voter an official ballot for use in such election, and such voter may vote a legal ballot and have the same mailed to the county clerk of his county to be voted.



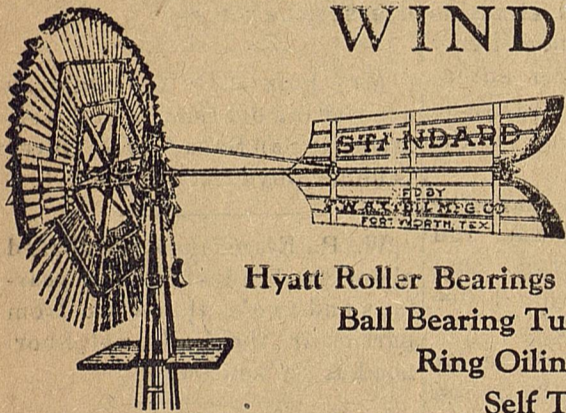

KILL MAN IN FEUD

Postmaster of Telegraph Shot
By Unknown Person on Hill
side—Had Trouble Month Ago

Junction, July 8.—O. L. Freeman, 40 years old, prominent
ranchman, postmaster and proprietor of a general store at
Telegraph, about 20 miles south of Junction, was buried at Ker-
ville at 3 o'clock Friday afternoon, following a shooting on
Thursday afternoon. He is survived by a wife and several chil-
dren.

Mr. Freeman was killed instantly about 1 o'clock Thurs-
day afternoon while standing in front of his store. A 30-30 cali-
ber bullet entered the back of his neck and came out through
his shoulder. The person who fired the shot is unknown.

About a month ago Mr. Freeman killed Ed Fleming in a gun
duel, in which Freeman himself was seriously injured, being
shot but the wound not proving serious. The cause of the trou-
ble at that time is said to have been over a fence line, the
aches of the two adjoining.

Mr. Freeman was talking to occupants of an automobile
which was stopped in front of the store when the shot was fired.
The store was at the foot of a hill being covered with
cedar trees, making it difficult to see any one among them.

It was from some place on this hill supposed to be about 150
yards from the store, that the shot was fired. After a short
futile search, telegrams were sent over the state in an effort
to secure blood hounds to be used in the search, but none
were available. Two sons of Fleming, the man whom Freeman
killed, were arrested on suspicion. One was liberated shortly
after the arrest while the other was placed under a bond of
\$500—San Angelo Standard

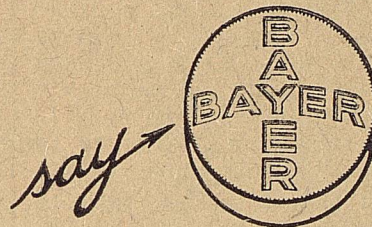
