Three-Mill Tax for State

Schools to be Proposed.

Austin.—Representative Roy Coffee of Wise County, one of the youngest members of the last Legislature, and who is a candidate for re-election without opposition, said he will advocate a constitutional amendment at the next session of the Legislature proposing a mill tax for the support of the public schools of the State. He believes that such a tax is the only solution of the school question and its adoption would forever remove the schools from politics.

Coffee said that a 3-mill tax would produce at least \$10.000,-000 a year, which he believes would come very near support-ing the schools. However, he is not committed to 3-mill and will support a higher tax should it be deemed expedient and necessary. He is now compiling a bulletin on this subject which will be ready shortly for distribution to members of the next Legislature, and which bulletin will also be used for debating purposes by the Interscholastic League.


