Clarence Ousley leads Culbertson by three votes, Neff leads by big majority. Steward leads for representative, Ford leads Judge, Luedecke for Sheriff, McCormick leads for Tax-Assessor, other County candidate have everything no opposition, the largest number of votes were cast in County Judge's race which was 627, the county voting strength being 750, 127 voters not voting.

To Have Second Primary.

There will be a second primary in the Tax-Assessors race and County Judge's race in Schleicher County August 20, there will also be a few run-off among the State officers.

The State returns show that Gov. Neff was elected by big majority. Uncle Billie Mayfield received largest number of votes for Lieutenant Governor, Earl B. Mayfield and James E. Ferguson leads in Senatorial contest.

B. J. Steward is elected Representative from this district by big majority over H. G. Perry of Junction.

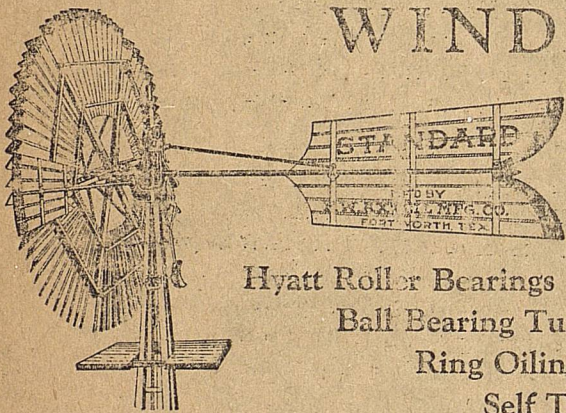

In speaking of the election both in state and county the Dallas News says:

"The Ku Klux Klan appealed to the electorate of Dallas County for an indorsement of its ideals, its principles and its purposes. What it asked for it has obtained, and in a degree which, if it does not quiet fill the measure of its hopes, must overflow the measure of its expectations. All of the candidates for state offices who had the favor of its indorsement seems to have won a plurality of the votes cast in the primary. Most of them won decisive pluralities. Of its own nominees for courthouse offices, only one has been defeated, and only one other has fallen short of a majority. It may be true that some of its victorious nominees owe their success as much to their personal popularity as to the favor of the Ku Klux Klan. But the utmost that could be asserted on that score would make but a small deduction from the achievement of the organization. For itself.

From the returns of the election Saturday, it is indicated that the Ku Klux's won practically every candidate indorsed by them for a state office, and in counties where the klan was made a direct issue they won by over whelming majority. Miller a member of the Klan at Austin was re-elected having a majority over both opponents. Buchanan Sheriff of McClelland County, an anti-klan candidate, was overwhelmingly defeated, all klan candidates at Dallas and Ft. Worth won easy.

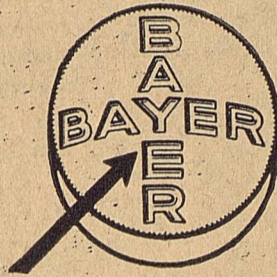
