

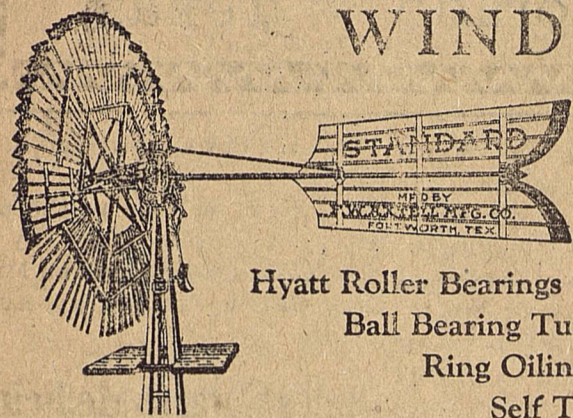

The report of W. L. Isaac and pay roll and expense account of \$276.59 was allowed.

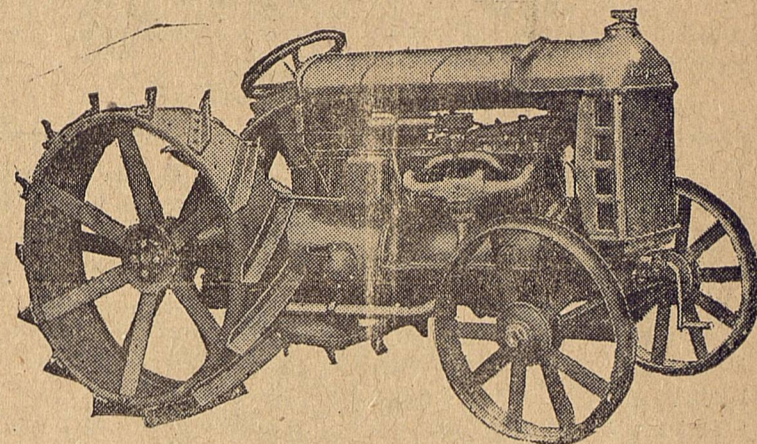
The pay roll and expense account of C. W. Ogden for \$372.72 was allowed.

## ANOTHER COLLISION BUT NO ONE HURT.

Friday night while returning from San Angelo, C. C. Doty met and collided with Roy Davidson who was going north, the accident occurred on the approach of the culvert near the Mather gate about two and one half miles north of Eldorado. Mr. Doty was driving a Ford and was accompanied by his daughter, Miss Annie Marie, and Mrs. Theo Andrews and two daughters of Toyah. Mr. Davidson was driving a Buick with bright light including a spot-light, this blinded Mr. Doty and he could not tell where he was on the highway, consequently he got too far to the Davidson side of the road which caused the collision. Mrs. Davidson had two young ladies in the car with him but fortunately no one in either car was the least bit bruised.

The Doty car was put out of commission, the Davidson car was only slightly damaged.

The State appropriation for the next fiscal year, available from the school fund, will not likely exceed \$10 per capita. This decrease will be due in a great measure to reduced taxable valuation for 1922.

It is planned, however, to make an application to the Legislature which meets in January for an emergency appropriation of \$3,000,000 or \$4,000,000 for the Texas schools.

The State Automatic Tax Board recently increased the ad valorem tax rate to the constitutional limit of 35 cents on the \$100 property valuation.

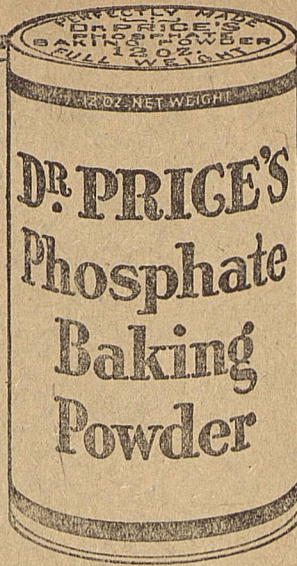

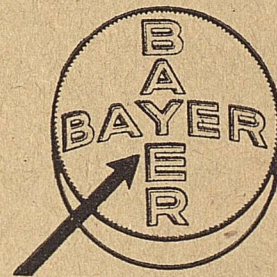
