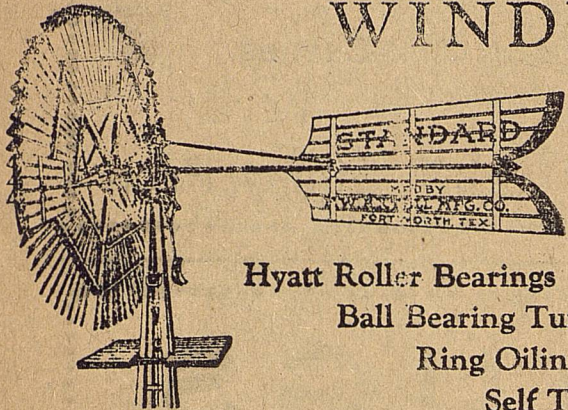

DEMONSTRATION AGENT TO VISIT OLDORADO.

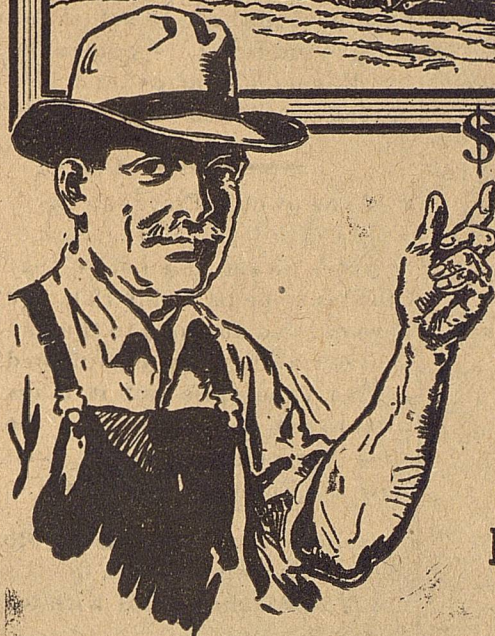
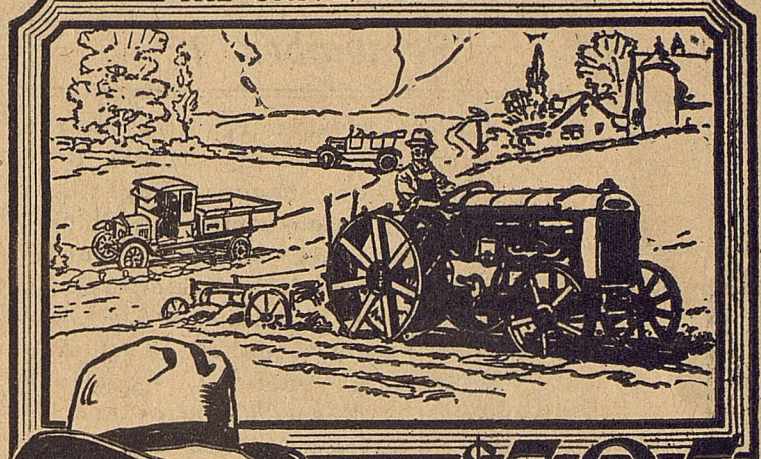

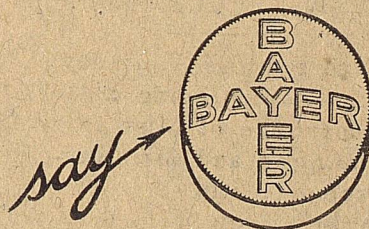
