

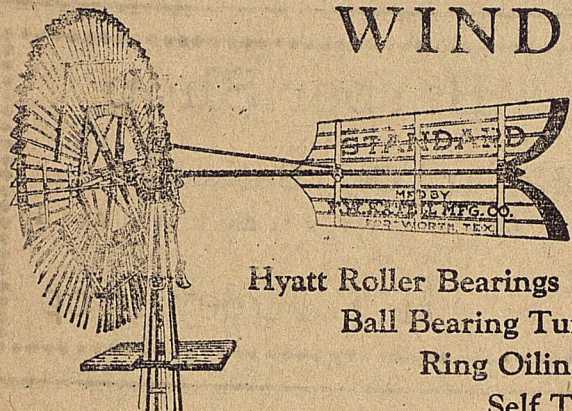

## FORD PLANTS CLOSE.

As a protest against paying what he believes to be exorbitant prices for coal and steel, Henry Ford, automobile manufacturer, has begun to close down his industry. Approximately 100,000 men will be made idle indefinitely as the result of this action.

The plant affected include the five at Detroit and numerous assembling stations throughout the country. The first lay-off occurred September 16.

## J. F. O'HARROW REPORTS TO HAVE OIL IN WELL.

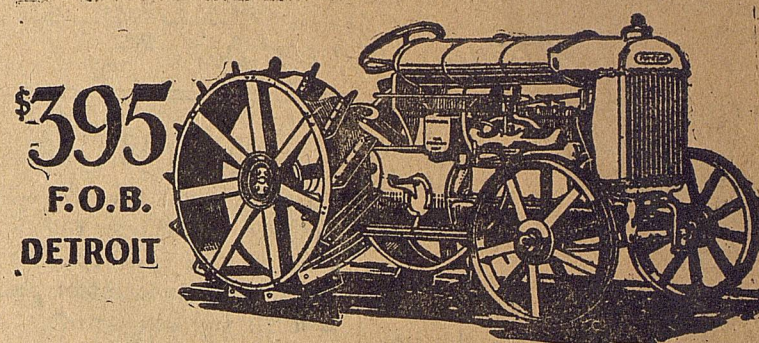

Mr. Brown has been drilling in the Mexia Oil Field for the past 12 months and is a good drilled, he will probably set up a Star rig and enlarge the present hole.

Mr. O'Harrow is confident he now has as much as 10 barrels per day and that he will bring in a paying well within the next 50 feet. He dreamed that a large quantities of oil underlay his ranch.

## COUNTY COURT MAKES SOME CHANGES.

The Commissioners' Court met Monday and transacted some business. The resignation of Judge Womack, Commissioners L. E. Ratliff and H. M. Friend, were offered to become effective when their successors could be appointed and qualified, Judge Ford the nominee was appointed Judge and qualified, Lee Williams the nominee for Commissioner precinct four was appointed Commissioner and was present and qualified. L. L. Ball was appointed to fill the unexpired term of H. M. Freund he being the nominee for precinct two, but on account of the illness of his father he was not here to qualify. The court then recessed until Friday when they will meet again.

Judge Womack will go to Galveston and study pharmacy, the Commissioners resigned as to let the newly elected officers who will take office this fall get in on the beginning of the other road work and handle the entire project, the first road contract being virtually completed.

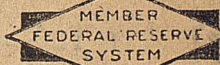

Felix Miller returned from Brady Wednesday afternoon and brought back facts about Mr. Shugart's death, he died from poison gas caused from dynamite which had been used in blasting in the well, some 30 or 40 minutes after the explosion the men discussed the feasibility of going down in the well, Mr. Shugart believing there was no danger descended, but soon called to be drawn up, the helpers drew him up but when he reached the fresh air near the top he gave way and fell back.

Green Crisp, who is a brother-in-law to Jim Myres of our city, was passing by in a wagon and saw the excitement at the well and to assist them, he insisted on going down in the well to tie a rope around Mr. Shugart, the other men warned him of the danger and that the gas would overcome him, he still insisted and descended, without tying a rope around him, he too called to be pulled up which immediately done, but when he came in contact with fresh air near the top he gave way and fell back as did Mr. Shugart. Men from town was soon on the scene and with a gas mask soon had the men on top of the ground, but Crisp was the only one that showed signs of life, he breathed a few times only.

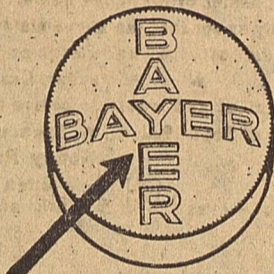
