

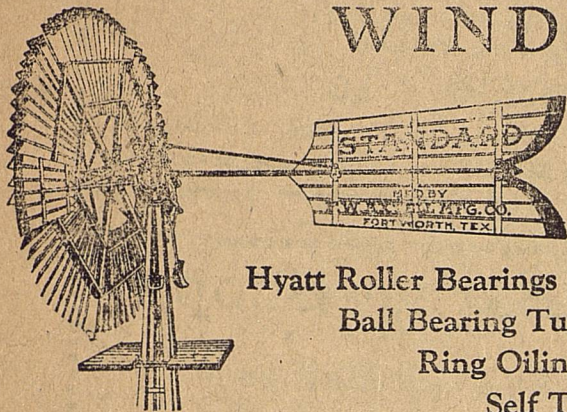

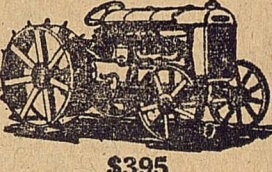
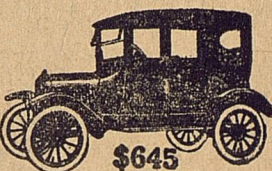
MICA MINE IN LLANO BEING OPENED UP.

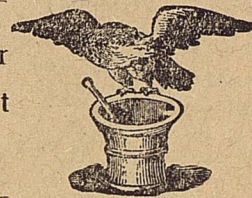

COMMISSIONERS' COURT.

The Commissioners' Court met in regular session Monday Oct. 9, with all members present, after allowing the various accounts, approved the following business was transacted.

It is ordered by the court that H. F. Thomson be allowed \$50 for change in right-of-way from station 150-60 to 173-30, and drainage ditch at station 228, he to remove and adjust his fence between stations.

Tuesday's Session.

On this 10th day of October, A. D. 1922, came on to be considered the change in the San Angelo-Eldorado Public road beginning at station 350-60; Thence to station 379-30; Thence through T. G. Chaney's land to station 464; Thence through Guy Bodine's land to station 517-12; Thence through Docia Smith's; land to station 542-75; Thence through A. K. Bailey's land to station 574-10; Thence through Doc Kerr's land to station 590-10; Thence through Mrs. E. B. Ross' land from station 592-8 and terminating at station 530-30.

And it appearing to the court that said change will be advantageous It is therefore ordered by the court, that J. L. McElroy, Tom Martin, J. O. Willoughby, Jess Koy and C. A. Spencer, five freeholders of said County be and are hereby appointed a jury of view, a majority of whom after taking the prescribed oath before a proper authorized person, proceed to assess damages, if any or claimed, and to lay out, survey and describe such road to the greatest advantage to the public, so that the same can be traced with certainty, and the field notes of such survey and description of the road together with a statement of damages assessed, if any, shall be included in the report of the jury, and, if adopted, shall be recorded in the minutes of the Commissioners' court. And it is further ordered, that the said jury make a report in this cause at the next regular meeting of the court.

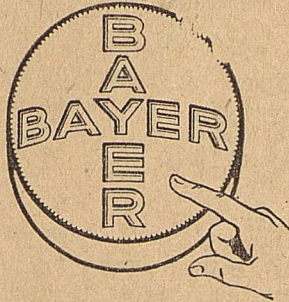
