

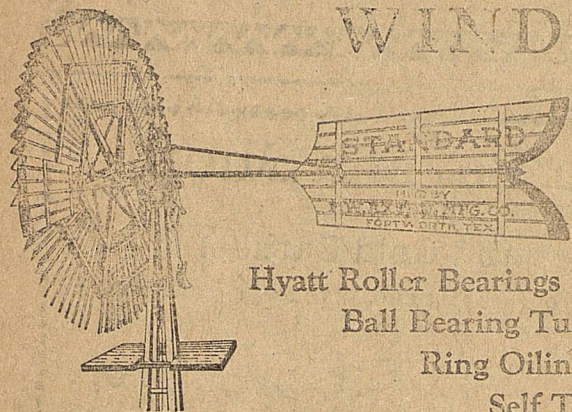

Governor Neff has pardoned Fisher Alsop and remitted fine of \$2,000, and at the same time forgives Alsop for his transgressions Alsop who was running the Ferguson Forum, was indicted and found guilty of libel by a jury, and was fined \$2,000, not being able to pay the fine was placed in jail and was working out his fine at 50 cents a day. Several of our farmers made good money last year out of turkeys and have large flocks now, while others lost money trying to raise sheep and cattle exclusively.

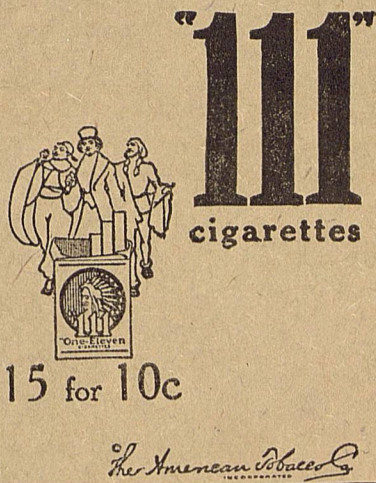

Hunting Information.

BAG LIMIT.

Three buck deer during the season from November first to December thirty-first, inclusive, each year.

Open season on turkey in Gillespie and Kendall Counties March and April. Limit three wild turkey gobblers.

Open season on turkey in Angelina, Cherokee, Hardin, Liberty, Nacogdoches, Dallas, Rockwall, Tyler, Jefferson, Orange, Jasper and Newton Counties March and April. Limit two wild turkey gobblers.

Open season on turkey in all other counties November and December. Limit three wild turkey gobblers.

There is a closed season on turkey in the following counties: Hidalgo, Willacy, Cameron, Kennedy, Starr, Brooks, Jim Hogg and McMullen.

Fifteen doves in one day, from September 1st to December 15, inclusive.

Fifteen quail and Mexican pheasants (known as "Chacala-

ca"), in one day, December 1st to January 31st, inclusive.

Twenty-five ducks in one day from October 16th to January 31.

Eight geese (per day, from October 16th to January 31st, inclusive.

You are not allowed to kill more than aggregate of twenty-five in any one day of ducks, geese, brant, blackbellied and golden plovers, and yellowlegs, Wilson snipe or Jack snipe.

You must not buy, sell or barter any wild game or game birds.

You must not catch, kill or have in your possession nor ship at any one time more than the aggregate of seventy-five ducks, geese, brant and birds.

You must not kill a turkey hen at any time.

You must not kill any doe or spotted fawn at any time.

You must not catch, kill or have in your possession any wild song birds. You must not hunt any wild game or wild game birds at night with any kind of light or lantern.

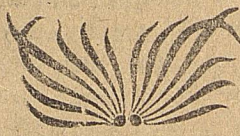

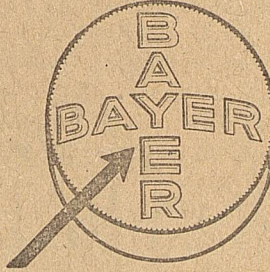
