

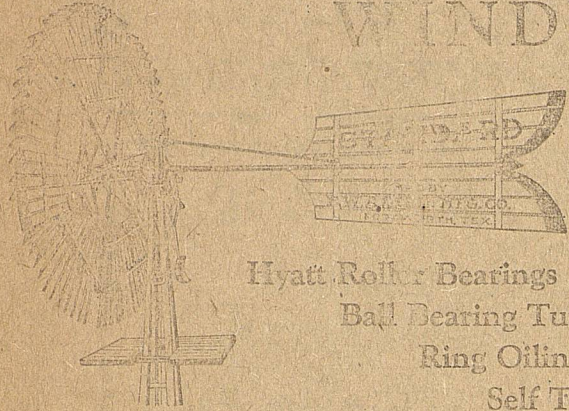

COMMISSIONER' COURT PROCEEDINGS.

The Commissioners' Court met Nov. 15, with all members present except L. L. Ball.

After allowing the various accounts as recorded on page 151 and 152 of Commissioners Court minutes.

The jury of view appointed at October term, to survey out and establish a road from the Calcote Store to the north end of the present pike, also to assess damages on same, reported to this term of court that they had performed their duty and the damages assessed being as follows: R. L. Calcote \$50, Guy Bodine \$800, Mrs. Docie Smith \$750, A. K. Bailey \$730, Doc Kerr \$287.50 and Mrs. E. B. Ross \$125.

The court ordered that this road be opened up and is hereby classified as a County seat to County seat road of first class.

The quarterly report of C. C. Doty, P. H. McCormick and J. F. Isaacs were approved.

The Court set the salary of the County Treasury, beginning January 1, 1923, at one half of one per cent for receiving and one half of one per cent for disbursing the county funds.

B. M. Whiteker, Secretary of the West Texas C. of C., and Dr. A. J. Lewis, of Haskell, were in Eldorado a while Friday afternoon, and spent a few minutes with The Success office. Mr. Whiteker was on his way to the Experiment Station Sutton county to investigate the work being done there. He says the State authorities are contemplating doing away with the 4 West Texas Experiment Station and that the West Texas Chamber of Commerce was going to make a big fight for them to be maintained in West Texas, the West being entitled to some consideration.

Mr. Whiteker was glad to know that The Schleicher County Chamber of Commerce had been organized, which account he had seen in the press, and called on the Secretary and assures us that the West Texas Chamber of Commerce was ready to assist, and would lend us a helping hand and especially in the publicity department.

Mr. Whiteker asks the assistance of all West Texas people in trying to have the West Texas Experiment Stations kept up for the benefit of the West.

Mrs. E. B. Ross has moved back to her place five miles north of town.

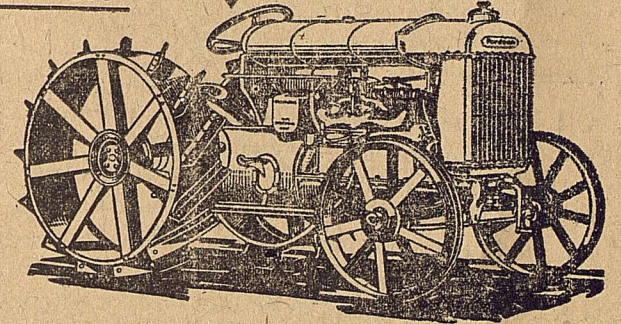
H. F. SOFSEE BUYS T. K. WOMACK STOCKFARM.

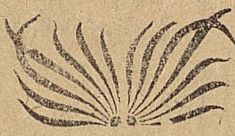


