McKavett was transformed back to the active Army post it had been in the mid19th century. ## Take Advantage of Property Tax Benefits

Renditions: All property owners have the right to render their property to the Appraisal District. A rendition is a written document stating the name and address of the owner, the legal description of the property and may contain a estimate of the value. It must be submitted to the District between January 1 and April 16.

Protests: All property owners with real or personal property that has increased in val uation by $\$ 1000$ or more will receive a notice of appraised value. These notices will be mailed in May. If the property owner is dissatisfied with the value set by the district he should contact the Appraisal District to discuss the valuation. If the question is not resolved, he may appeal to the Appraisal Review Board for an adjustment. That protest must be filed by May 31, or within 30 days of the notice, whichever is later.
Homeowners: The Texas Legislature and many local government entities have allowed for part of the value of a homestead to be exempted from taxation. If you have a homestead exemption there is no need to re-file. However, if you have purchased a different home since January 1, 2001 you will need to file for this exemption. If you have ques-
tions or need an application you should contact us at the address or phone number listed below.

Over-65 and Disabled Homeowners: The Texas Legislature allows many local government entities to grant substantial tax relief for homeowners who are over 65 or disabled. A minimum of $\$ 10,000$ value exemption is available from all school districts. In addition, over-65 homeowners may have the amount of school tax frozen the year afte they are 65. A taxpayer is not eligible for both over 65 and a disability exemption. If you qualify for both, the over 65 exemption will reduce your taxes more than the disability exemptions
Quarterly Payments and Tax Deferral: If you are 65 or older and have applied for the homestead exemptions for senior citizens, you may pay your current taxes on your home in four installments. Homeowners who are disabled and apply for homestead exemptions also may pay their home taxes in installments. If you are over 65 years of age and are unable to pay your property taxes on your homestead you may be able to defer paym For additional information contact the Appraisal District at the number listed below.

Farmers and Ranchers: Landowners who are using their land for commercial produc tion of food or fiber may be entitled to receive a special appraisal on their land, which is based on agriculture production. The land must have been utilized for farming or ranching for five of the last seven years and be currently devoted to agricultural use. If you have not been receiving Ag use appraisal on your land in the past and wish to apply, you may receive an application by contacting us at the, address listed below.

Disabled Veterans: You may qualify for a property tax exemption if you are either (1) a veteran who was disabled while serving with the U.S. armed forces or (2) the surviving spouse or child (under 18 of age and unmarried) of
the armed force who was killed while on active duty

Fagan-Cook also explained that the legislation that created the Schleicher County Hospital Dis trict requires that board members be property owners within the county, subject to taxation. She noted that one individual, who does not currently meet the requirement, inquired about running for board but was told that he was not eligible.
Ms. Fagan-Cook further ex plained that a vote of the citizens would be required before the Tex as Legislature could be asked to amend the legislation under which the district was created. If that passed, then a statewide vote
would be required for a constitutional amendment. Otherwise, Fa-gan-Cook, added a lawsuit by a interested party might result in the courts changing the rules. At that point, Randy Mankin said that he has always believed the rule could not withstand a constitutional challenge in the courts.
Asked after the meeting about likelihood of having three vacan cies on the board following the
election in May, Mankin said that election in May, Mankin said that
there are currently no plans to fill there are currently no plans to fil the seats. "That will be a decision the board will have to make, Mankin stated.
New Business began with the appointment of Physician's Assis tant "Ike" Whitten to active statt It was explained that Whitten will soon be sharing emergency room coverage with Dr. Pat Taylor. To pave the way for Whitten to cover the emergency room, the trustee amended the district's medical staff bylaws as well as the board of trustee bylaws. Randy Mankin explained that the hospital's paricipation in Medicare's Critical Access Program makes it possible for the emergency room to be cov ered by a physician's assistant. It was also noted that Whitten will be supervised by Dr. Taylor, during those times when he is covering the E.R.
The board also learned that a computer software package, approved two months ago, will be installed on the district's busines office during the month of May. According to Ann Fagan-Cook the software will speed up the filing of insurance claims, resulting in a more timely payments. Management consultants Andy Freeman and Jerry Hulin explained that additional software will be needed to modernize the clinic's business office. They were asked by the board to bring a recommendation concerning clinic software to the board's next meeting tentatively scheduled for April 22.
There being no further busi ness, the meeting adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
