The Board of Equalization for our countywide school district met at the Court House last Thursday and were presented a tentative budget for the $1974-75$ school year in the amount, of $\$ 590,595$. Official adoption of the budget will take place in November.

The new budget is $\$ 38,205$ higher than the $\$ 552,390$ of a year ago and in 1972 the budget was $\$ 559,288$. The new budget figures were given as follows:
