El Dorado Success.

The reports from the sales of wool made last week at San Angelo seems to me to be discouraging to the sheep man eight months clip sold at 8 to 13 cents. All our woollen goods are still high as they were when wool brought from 20 to 24 cents per pound, now there must be a cause for so great a drop in prices. It should put the high Tariff and the so called wool Democrats to thinking. Many good honest Democrats have had the scales put over their eyes and have voted to sustain the iniquitous Dingley Tariff laws that had the effect apparently of protecting their interest when at the same time it was enriching the big manufacturers at their expenses without them knowing it. And tramping on our heels telling the people that the Democratic party was the sole cause of our wool, cotton and hides being worthless.

And now under a "full fledged" Republican administration we have just passed through one of the worst "money panics" the world ever knew. The time is at hand when the people will not stand for such rot any longer.

(By the people, I mean the farmers and stockmen) as most all other occupations are largely carried on by speculation on our labor in other words we are hirelings of the rich, though we produce we have no word in what we shall have for our products, our grain is almost no value until it is put in the great elevators, and then it suddenly gets to be of great value as it is shipped back to us, we have the power but not the courage. The principals advocated by Mr. Jefferson is in our power if we were educated to a proper understanding of our own needs. A government by the people and for the people. Equal rights to all and special privileges to none which is the

great fundamental principles of Democracy. The Republicans all agree that the Dingley Tariff should be revised but was afraid to meddle with it as that would incur the disfavor of the big manufacturers. As there is no such thing as pulling the "wool" over their eyes they are wide awake twenty-four hours each day, and are always on hand to see that their corns are not trampled on. We as laborers are not able to employ "jobysts" to stay at Washington to see that we have laws passed that will be fair and just to us. But must be content to stay at home to labor with our farms and stock while a majority of us have faith in the dominant party to take care of our interest. Now in the face of these facts, do you believe that high Tariff protects your wool? Do you believe it protects your hides? Do you believe it cheapens your iron and steel? If what I have stated is true every farmer and laborer in the United States should vote against the Republican party.

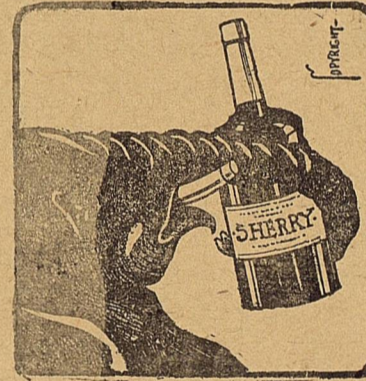
