### BARBECUE AT FT. MCKAVETT.

Far once in life we had the pleasure of partaking of the many good things prepared by the Ft. McKavett people. The barbecue that was pulled off their on June 24 was a success from any point of view. As we left home on Monday and started down the draw that leads into the head waters of the San Saba river, we could hear of the barbecue, when we reached the 6 mile ranch this side of McKavett which is owned by Wm. Bevans and superintended by J. F. Nixon, we learned that two beaves had been slaughtered from that ranch, from this place we went to the John F. Webster ranch where we found that the good lady had baked eleven cakes for the picnic—and here we had the pleasure of eating some of the best cake we believe we ever ate and it made us think of what was coming on the morrow, so after spending a short but pleasant time with these good people, we journeyed on our way towards the little city built of stone, our next stop was at our friend Joe Ruff, one of the oldest settlers of Schleicher county and he began to tell us that our little city was not the only city in Texas and that our Divide land was not the only land, so he had us view over his farm, which was a beauty and we will say that the crop looked fine, but back to our picnic. Mr. Ruff told us that the best was to be had the next day, so we bid him adieu to meet him the next day and we journeyed on to the Williamson stock farm where we had the pleasure of spending the night with these good people, here we found one of the prettiest homes and stock farms in Schleicher county, and we hope some day to see homes like this one built on every section of land in this county. Well we reached Ft. McKavett the morning of the 24th and found that the people had began to gather from

every adjoining county, from San Angelo, Menardville, Junction City, Sonora and Schleicher county, and a big lot of candidates from Eldorado. The first thing pulled off in the morning was a ball game between Sonora and McKavett which was played to a finish resulting in favor of Sonora, the people then all left for the large Pecan Grove on the banks of the San Saba about one half mile from town, here we found five beaves and 12 muttons had been barbecued, with all kinds of Pies, Cakes, Salides and pickles.

Here about 700 people were filled until they wished for nothing but a place to sit down. After dinner Hon. Brown F. Lee made a short speech on what he would try to do when he went to Austin to represent this 102nd district, after his talk there was several Menard county candidates called upon to speak and some responded to the call. Then the crowd left for the ball ground where one of the hottest ball games of the season was pulled off between Menardville and Sonora teams, Sonora won the day by odds. We will say to all, that the Fort McKavett Barbecue was a success from beginning to end and we hope to again enjoy another day on the San Saba River picnicing

It appears from what we can learn that some of the Schleicher county married men had trouble in getting partners to dance with at the Cristoval barbecue. These men left their wives at home and was out for a good time and perhaps they had it, we wouldnt tell who they were for any thing, but Will, Jim and John all report having a royal time.

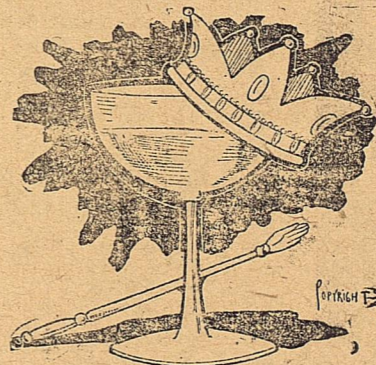

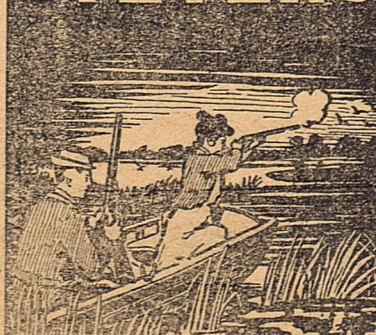

The drowned boy is the fourteen year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Mather, who formerly resided in San Angelo, but who are now living on their ranch in Schleicher county. Mrs. Mather, her daughter and son, William, arrived in Christoval early Tuesday afternoon to visit Mrs. W. B. Harris and to attend the barbecue at that place today.

A large crowd of Christoval people quickly gathered on the banks of the river, and the body was soon rescued. All efforts to restore the lad to life were in vain.

In response to a phone message the Angelo Furniture & Undertaking Company sent a man to Christoval Tuesday evening to prepare the body for burial. The remains left Christoval at 4 o'clock this morning and interment was in Fairmount cemetery today at noon.

This was one of the saddest deaths ever chronicled in the Concho County. The Standard joins with many friends in extending condolence to the bereft ones in this moment of sudden sorrow.

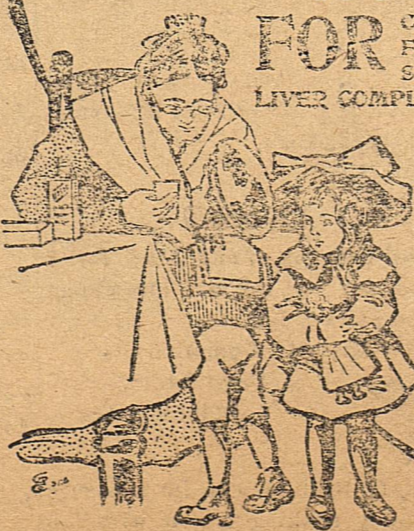
