J. Tom Green and wife were in the city Wednesday, shopping and buying supplies.

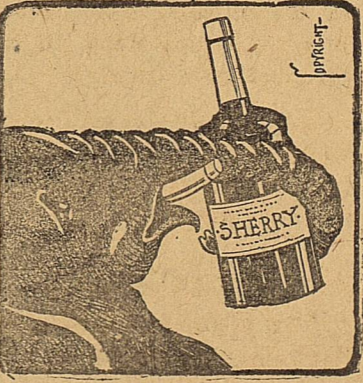
