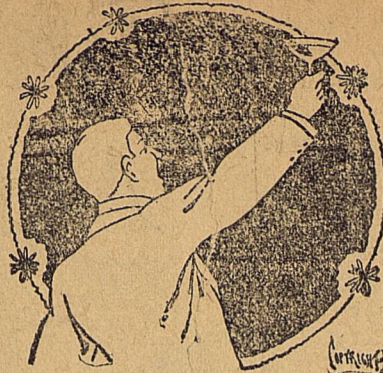

SCHLEICHER COUNTY EXHIBITS

AT SAN ANGELO.

Beavers and Sweatt sent in an
exhibit to be placed in the ex-
hibition hall—The exhibition
was gathered hurriedly but will
show what the soil of Schlei-
cher county will produce. The
German Millit that left for the fair
was given by J. F. McKee, Mr.
McKee raised on 4 and 3 4 acres
of land 17 1 2 bushels of Millet
which is estimated to be worth \$2
per bushel, besides the grain Mr.
McKee baled 150 bales of straw
which he disposed of at 20 cents
per bael. The Milo maize meal
that goes to the fair was grown
by Mr. McKee and ground at the
mill, this sells for \$1.75 per 100
lbs. Mr. McKee farmed on the
J. B. Burtens place about two
miles west of Eldorado. A large
cub weighing 10 1 4 lbs also went
to the fair from our city, this best
was grown by F. E. Russell.

The Red Proof Oats was raised
by Dr. Patton on the old Vermont
ranch on new land, the oats weigh
36 lbs. per bushel, and made a-
bout 35 bushels per acre. Some
Rye was gathered from the I. H.
Elder ranch and was added to the
exhibition, that left Monday. The
turnips was pulled from E. Foster
patch and weighed from 2 1 2 to
3 1 2 lbs. The buck eyes peas
was raised by the L. D. C. Co.,
about 8 miles North west of town
and yielded a fine crop, some
corn was sent to the fair, this was
raised on the J. Booth farm, the
corn made about 45 bushels per
acre and will doubtless show up
with other corn raised in west
Texas.

Milo maize that was grown by
V. M. Bearce was added to the
exhibition and left for San An-
geles with the other.

Also cotton was added, this was
grown by Dr. Patton on his farm
about five miles north of town.

This product is not the best
that Schleicher county could pro-
duce as it was gathered hurriedly.

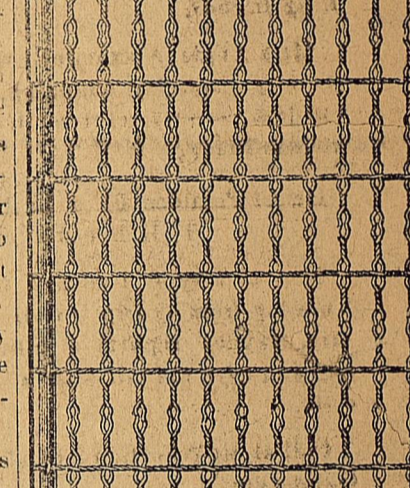
