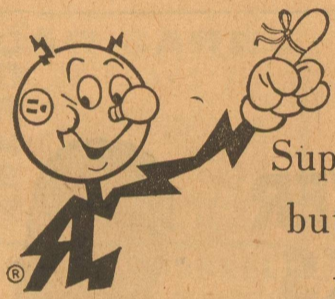


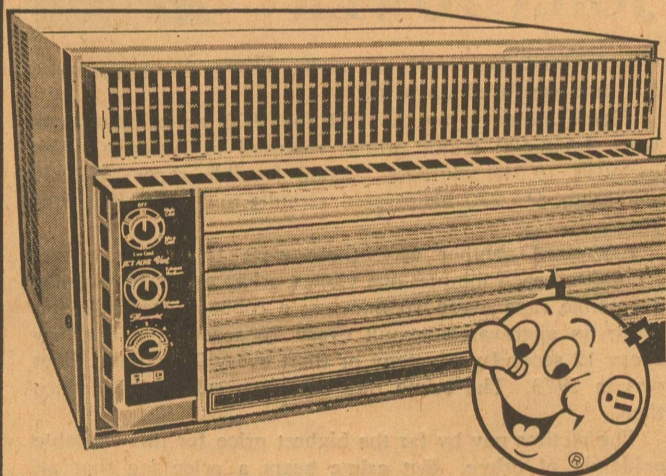

Something For Everyone At Kerrville Fair

Kerrville, Tex.—The 4th annual Texas Arts & Crafts Fair at Kerrville July 4-6 has something for everyone.

In addition to the more than 200 Texas artists and craftsmen who display and sell their wares under colorful striped tents along winding Quinlan Creek on the rolling tree covered fair grounds at Schreiner College, there will be all kinds of good food with as much variety as you could imagine, and, of course, cold drinks of all kinds.

There is a photographer contest which everyone can enter with prizes for both black and white and color categories running \$100 first prize, \$75 second prize and \$50 third prize. Both the fair and the concurrent July 3-4-5 Kerrville C&W Jamboree offer abundant subject matter for amateur and professional photographers to shoot.

The fair also offers daily auctions and its Pioneer Village with fascinating demonstrations of pioneer crafts which were part of the early day life in Texas. Fairgoers will see weavers, black smithing, wood carving, leather working, pottery making, and all kinds of

crafts actually being done in the village.

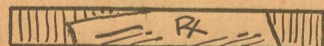
