cient in alkaline soils. Plants use only minimal amount of the nutrients, so they should be applied
cautiously to the soil Manures make doubly good fertwith their high organic content while at the same time contribut-
ing to soil fertility However, manures contain about $10 \%$ salt and
should be applied properly to prevent salt burn.
It is recommended adding manure to soil a few weeks before
planting and then following with irrigation.
If using manure as a surface mulch, apply during the fall or
winter and keen it from winter and keep it from direct con-
tact with stems and roots of tact with
plants.
