### SAYS UVALDE WILL GET JONES ROAD.

M. M. McFarland, president of the Uvalde Business Men's Club, is in receipt of a letter from his brother, T. C. McFarland, dated at Brownwood, Texas, on October 2nd, which intimates that Uvalde has the best of chances to get a north and south trunk line to the Gulf or to Laredo, and possibly both places. Eliminating parts of the letter purely personal, it reads as follows:

"Saw L. J. Wardlaw, county Judge of Sonora, at San Angelo yesterday. Was with him for a couple of days. He told me that Morgan Jones told him that his object in making San Angelo was to build on south to Uvalde and thence to Laredo and also some point on the Gulf. The Santa Fe, however, jumped in a head of him on the southern extension from Angelo. But Jones says he will probably build on to Uvalde from Ballinger. Wardlaw is a shrewd, well posted fellow and he says it is only a question of time when Uvalde will have two or three

trunk lines, one of which will be the Santa Fe, and the other the Orient, also the Morgan Jones line. He owns land near Uvalde now, and says he has been for some time thinking of moving there. He says the climate and soil in that part of Texas has all others skinned, and that right now all eyes are turned towards that part of Texas. Says, when it gets a good start, the rapid growth will surpass that of the Panhandle country. Also says that Panama Canal will force all big railroads to seek entrance to the Gulf ports, etc."

People through this section believe that Uvalde is the logical point for these railroads to make their way to the coast, or to Laredo or Brownsville. The only thing anticipated is that a knowledge of this fact may keep the Uvalde people inactive until some other point, through superior effort, gets what might easily have been brought here. — Uvalde Ledger-News.

### DEATH OF MRS. E. S. BROWN.

News was received the latter part of last week, announcing the death of Mrs. E. S. Brown, mother to our country man, G. M. Brown and Mrs. R. P. Hinyard. Mrs. Brown died at Hamlin on Oct 2nd, and her remains were taken to the old home at San Saba for burial. She leaves a number of children to mourn her departure, but leaves a Christian life well spent in front of them. Mr. Brown and Mrs. Hinyard have many friends in this county who extend condolence to them in the loss of a mother.

Mrs. E. S. Brown died last Saturday night shortly after midnight at her home in Hamlin, Texas, to which place she had moved some two years ago. The body was brought back to the old home for burial and Tuesday was laid to rest beside the husband whom she had buried in the China Creek Cemetery several years before. Rev. T. F. Dimmitt conducted the funeral services from the China Methodist Church. The corpse was accompanied by her sons, N. A. Geo. E. L. Orrin and Joe and daughter, Miss Bessie.

A great concourse of people from town and all the surrounding communities gathered at the cemetery to pay the last sad rites of respect to one they had known and loved in life. Mrs. Brown was a member of the Methodist church and was one of its most loyal, active, zealous workers and died in a triumphant faith that death is but a gateway opening into a

realm of eternal life and never ending bliss.

### SANTA FE OFFICIALS COMING.

The San Angelo Daily Standard of Monday announced the coming of the Santa Fe head Officials to San Angelo and the Standard said in part:

A majority of the Santa Fe officials in Texas will be in the party. This suggests the idea that all will look into the extension of the Santa Fe from San Angelo to some point south of here, presumably Eldorado and thence to Sonora or to the west through Ozona.

From reading the above it seems that the road will come as far south as Eldorado any way. Eldorado wants railroad connection with San Angelo and will give a handsome bonus for the first road this way and if the Santa Fe wants this plum, it's ripe and ready for service, and we are holding it out at arms length, we are not begging for a railroad but simply offering a good inducement.

### GETS IN TWO HIGH BRAED BILLY GOATS

Sam H. Hill, one of Schleicher county's fancy stock raisers, received two fine billy goats Thursday to add to his thoroughbred flocks. The two animals are known as "Half South Africans," raised from imported stock by Henry Fink, of Leon Springs, the most noted goats breeder in Texas. They were shipped by express, and arrived in the best of condition. Mr. Hill values the two at \$250. He may exhibit them at the fair next week. — San Angelo Standard.

Cashier W. B. Sayers, of the Wool Growers' Central Storage Company, smilingly stated this morning that his company received more wool Thursday than it had ever received in one day since the season opened, the number of consignments made reaching in weight the figure of forty-two thousand, six hundred thirty-eight pounds. The consigners were as follows:

G. W. Parks, of Eldorado, 680 pounds; S. L. Stanford of Eldorado, 459 pounds; Frank Spencer of Eldorado, 2,646 pounds; J. H. Harvey of Eldorado, 968 pounds; Couche & Cochran of Crockett county, 32,671 pounds; C. C. Montgomery of Crockett county, 5,214 pounds.

The Central Storage Company has received to date over 150,000 pounds of wool, and will receive a great deal more before the season is over. — San Angelo Standard.

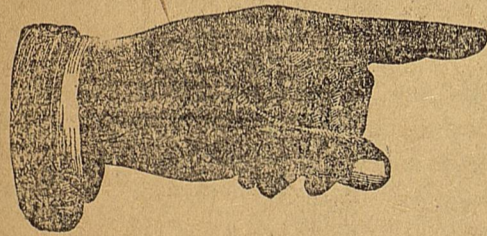
