





Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be so amended as to hearafter

Sec. 3 One-fourth of the revenue derived from the State occupation taxes and a poll tax of \$1 on every male inhabitant of this State between the age of 21 and 60 years shall be set apart anschool, and in addition thereto there shall be levied and collected an annual ad valorem State tax of such an amount. not to exceed 20 cents on the \$100 valuation, as with the available school fund arising from all other sources, will the public free schools of this State for a period of not less than six months in each year, and the Legislature may also provide for the formation of school districts by general or special law, with out the local notice required in other eases of special legislation, and all such school districts, whether created by general or special law, may embrace ourts of two or more counties. And the Legislature shall be authorized to pass laws for the assesment and collecion of taxes in all said districts and for the management and controle of the public school or schools of such districts whether such districts are composed of he Legis ature may authorize an additional ad valorem tax to be levied and collected within all school districts, heretofore formed or hereafter formed for the futher maintenance of public free schools, and the crection and equipment of school buildings therein, p:ovided that a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of the dis-


