Judge J. A. Whitten will be master of ceremonies for the day. All committees are expected to meet next Saturday night at the court house. The right to sell Cold drink on grounds will be sold to the highest sealed bid, all bids to be in the soliciting committee hands by Friday (today) noon, proceeds to go the expense of barbecue. The barbecue will be strictly a barbecue, no chicken and pie expected, the program will consist of speaking, cigar races, foot races and dancing and other entertaining features, a ball game is expected, the Eldorado band will furnish music for the day.

#### NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held at Court house in the town of Eldorado, within the Eldorado Independent School Districts, on the 17th day of July, 1909, to determine whether the bonds of said district shall be issued to the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) payable forty years from their date and bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a Public Free School Building of stone material and whether there shall be annually levied, assessed and collected on all the taxable property in said district, for the current year and annually thereafter while said bond, or any of them, are outstanding, a tax sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

C. O. Doty has been appointed manager of said election, which shall be held as nearly as may be possible in conformity with the general laws of the State.

No persons shall vote at said election unless he be a qualified voter under the Constitution of the laws of this State, and a taxpayer in said Eldorado Independent School District.

Those in favor of the issuance of the bonds and levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots "For The Bond and Tax" and those against the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax shall write or print on their ballots "Against the Bonds and the Tax".

Said election was ordered by the board of trustees of said Eldorado Independent School District by order passed on the 16th day of June, 1909 and this notice is issued pursuant to said order. Dated this 16th day of June, 1909.
