Comfortably esconced in H.A. White's touring car the committee put out by the Commercial Club, composed of Judge J.J. Foster, Dan Onshing, Leroy Taylor, and E.F. Howard, sped to San Carlos last Thursday morning where they were most patriotically received by Don Lorenz Trevion, whom they found to be a man of vast resources and experience in handling men and enterprise. The Don and our representative at once entered into a practical discussion of the proposed railroad from Allende, on the Mexican international to Brady or San Angelo. It developed that a survey had already been made from Allende to Las Vacas, a distance of ninety miles, and the grade is figured at 7.10 of 1 per cent (the grade on the International to Eagle Pass is 11.2 per cent), with 3 degrees of maximum curvatures as against 10 degrees to Eagle Pass. The road would pass through the towns of Morelos, Zaraposa and San Carlos, traversing a rich and fertile country. The cost including concrete combination bridge to span the Rio Grande, is estimated at \$1,000,000, and Don Trevion absolutely guarantees the building of the Southern end and intermediate towns will be given attention to Brady or San Angelo, including half the cost of the bridge. After furnishing the committee with an enormous amount of valuable data bearing on the subject, which has been forwarded to the office of the antisipated connected lines, Don Trevion entertained his guest with a twelve course dinner at his headquarters at San Carlos and afterward transported them over parts of his vast domains. The committee was astonished at the enterprise that confronted them at that point, especially the great work now under consideration of 3,000,000 making a...
