MR. TAFT'S SALARY \$100,000?

Senate Votes It, House is Expected to Agree—Other Increases.

It seems probable that President Taft will receive a salary double that of Mr. Roosevelt, and four times that which any President received up to Grant's second term.

The Senate, 33 to 32, voted in favor of \$100,000, after refusing to make it \$75,000.

The same bill increases the salaries of the Vice-President, Speaker and Chief Justice to \$15,000, and that of the Associate Justices to \$14,500 each. Another item gives the Vice-President and Speaker \$5000 a year additional for horses, carriages and "other



All this is to be completed within two weeks. "Ballinger already has three banks," said Mr. Russell, "but it is a fine business center and we think it can support another good bank. 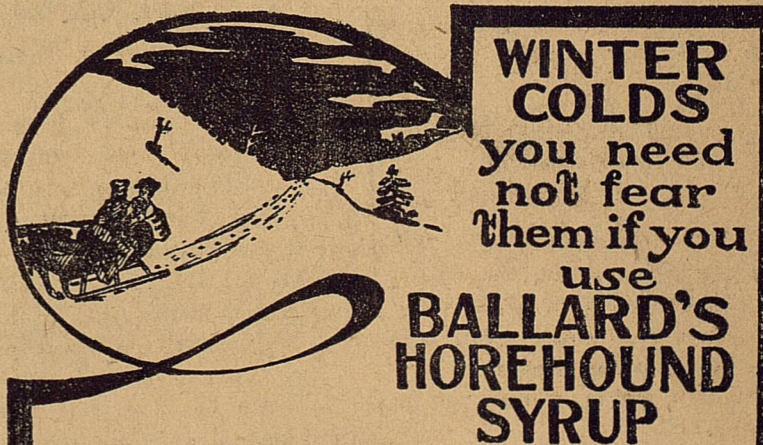
