EXTENSION OF SANTA FE RAILROAD SYSTEM.

Vice President and General Manager F. G. Pettibone of the Santa Fe returned to headquarters last week after a several weeks absence in the East. He came by way of Beaumont and the Gulf Interstate into Galveston, traveling on a special train. Mr. Pettibone spent some time in Chicago, conferring with the higher officials of the system on matters pertaining to the Gulf system, with special reference to the extensions in West Texas now in course of construction and contemplated.

Discussing operations in the western section of the state, where the Santa Fe is especially active in extending its lines, he said there was little to add to what had already been published about the work under way out there.

While he did not say in so many words, he intimated that extensions to the westward had only begun and that it is yet too early to take the public into confidence and announce the future plans of the company.

He said there is now a proposition before the people of San Angelo for the extension of the Lampasas branch from its western terminus at San Angelo southward to the southern border of Tom green county. It is quite likely this extension will be made. In railroad circles it is believed that this extension will be made beyond Tom Green county and that the road will be built to Eldorado in Schleicher county, almost due south from San Angelo. The other extensions which has

been decided upon is to extend the line from the Lampasas branch westward at Lometa, or some other point in that vicinity, via San Saba to Brady, which is the southern terminus of the Frisco.

It is believed that the extension will not stop at Brady, but will later be extended westward by south to Eldorado, and that eventually the Santa Fe will penetrate another section of virgin country southwestwardly to the Mexican border.

It has not been definitely decided whether the western extension to Brady will be made from Lometa or some other point nearby, all depending upon the engineers.

The preliminary surveys have been run and the surveying expedition is now running its locating lines to determine where the extension will tap the Lampasas branch.

And it seems to this writer that it would be a wise idea to induce the management of the Santa Fe to come on a little further west and take note of the immense advantages that would accrue to that road to come right on to Ozona, from Lometa to San Saba thence to Brady, thence to Menardville, thence to Eldorado and on to Ozona would make a railroad that could consistently be named "The Air Line."—Ozona Kicker.

Of course we as Eldoradoans would be pleased to see the Santa Fe make its terminus from both ways here, but we know of know other town in West Texas than the beautiful, virtuous and freeist from all crime Ozona we had rather be connected with by railroad facilities.

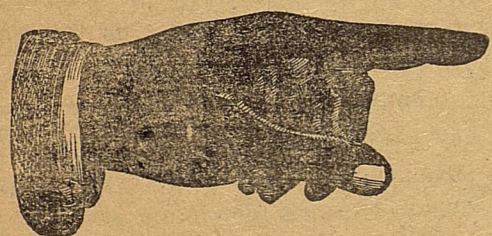

SAN ANGELO AND CHRISTOVAL ACCEPT ORIENT PROPOSITION.

Here is the proposition as published in San Angelo Standard.

"This proposition, on behalf of the Kansas City, Mexico & Orient Railroad Company of Texas, when accepted by the citizens of San Angelo and approved by E. Dickinson, the general manager, is to construct the south line of said K. C. M. & O. Ry. Co., of Texas, from a point south of, and at or near the stock yards of the company at San Angelo, to the south line of Tom Green county, via way of Christoval, in consideration of the donation of right-of-way from the point of divergence from the main line to the south line of Tom Green county, and said terminals 300x3,000 feet at Christoval.

This road to be constructed and at least one train to run the line within two years from the date of securing the right-of-way and terminals above stated to the said south line of Tom Green county.

The final acceptance of this proposition to be evidenced by a formal written contract entered into by the properly authorized officials of the said K. C. M. & O. Ry. Co., of Texas, and the committee representing the citizens of San Angelo and Tom Green county."

Now the only thing we don't like about the proposition is, that the Orient people want to much time in which to get to the south line of Tom Green county, of course that doesn't keep them from contracting with the Eldorado railroad committee to build to Eldorado within twelve months. Eldorado wants the Orient road but doesn't want to wait three or four years to get it, and if the road is two years in building to Christoval that would mean about four years for Eldorado.

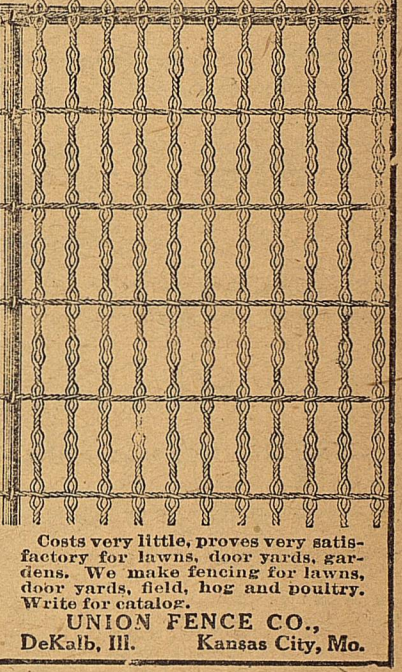

100 quarts whole milk they sleep, 80 of milk and 20 of water they squeal 50 " " 50 " more squeal 25 " " 75 " still squeal 0 " " 100 " no squeal

Suppose you are painting a house; how much will you gain by paint adulterated a quarter? half? three-quarters?

10 gallons Devco put-on \$30
15 " 1 4 not paint 75
20 " 1 2 " 100
40 " 3 4 " 200

The cost of paint put-on is about \$5 a gallon, no matter what paint you buy.

But nobody really gets 40 gallons on a 10-gallon job; so nobody really pays \$200 for painting a \$50 job; he stops at about \$100.

Two coats of 1-4 paint-and-3-4-trash doesn't make a good job; nor three; nor four.
